A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGAL REQUIREMENTS FOR NEIGHBORHOOD BOARD MEETINGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

"PART

SECTION 1. Chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
 by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read
 as follows:

NEIGHBORHOOD BOARD

§92-A Neighborhood board; notice and agenda; public input;
quorum. (a) Any contrary provision in this chapter
notwithstanding, the provisions of this part shall apply to
neighborhood boards overseen by a neighborhood commission in a
county with a population of 500,000 or more.

10 (b) The agenda required to be included in written public 11 notice of a neighborhood board meeting may include an 12 opportunity for the board to receive public input on issues not 13 specifically noticed for consideration at the forthcoming

14 meeting.

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15 (c) Any matter raised as part of the public input agenda 16 allowed under subsection (b) may be discussed and information on 17 the matter may be received by the board at the meeting; provided 18 that the board shall not make a decision relating to the matter. 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1 The board may make decisions on matters originally raised as 2 part of a public input agenda only at a later meeting, the 3 agenda for which shall give notice of decision-making on the 4 matter. 5 (d) A quorum for a meeting of a neighborhood board shall 6 be required for: 7 Conducting official board business; (1)8 (2) Discussions prior to and related to voting; and 9 (3) Voting required to validate an act of the board as 10 part of official board business. 11 A neighborhood board may receive information or testimony on a 12 matter of official board business without a quorum; provided 13 that the board shall not make a decision on the issue. 14 §92-B Permitted interactions of neighborhood board 15 members. (a) Two or more members of a neighborhood board, but 16 less than the number of members necessary to constitute a quorum 17 for the board, may attend informational meetings or 18 presentations on matters relating to official board business, 19 including meetings of another entity, seminars, and community 20 meetings; provided that the presentation is not specifically and 21 exclusively organized for or directed toward members of the 22 board.

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1 (b) Neighborhood board members may participate in discussions, including discussions among themselves; provided 2 3 that the discussions occur during and as part of the 4 informational meeting or presentation allowed by subsection (a); 5 and provided further that there is no deliberation or commitment 6 relating to a vote on the issue. The board members, at the next duly noticed meeting of the neighborhood board, shall report 7 8 their attendance and the matters presented and discussed that 9 related to official board business at the informational meeting 10 or presentation.

11 §92-C Neighborhood board meeting; unanticipated events; 12 public interest. An unanticipated event that occurs after 13 public notice of a neighborhood board meeting has been issued, 14 but before the scheduled meeting, may be the subject of 15 discussion and deliberation at the scheduled meeting if timely 16 action on the matter is necessary for public health, welfare, 17 and safety. At a duly noticed meeting, a board may take action 18 on an unanticipated event in the public interest that is not on the agenda in the same manner as if the board had held an 19 20 emergency meeting pursuant to section 92-8 to take action on the issue." 21



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1	SECTION 2. In codifying the new sections added by section
2	1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
3	appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
4	the new sections in this Act.
5	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
