A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ESTABLISHING A GLOBAL YOUTH CENTER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. World peace is a major collaborative goal and 2 youth are the key to attaining world peace, environmental

3 sustainability, and human and economic productivity for future

4 generations. Hawaii's location at the center of the Pacific rim

region between Asia and the Americas, its diverse culture, and

6 its many shared languages provide an excellent strategic forum

7 for meetings and exchanges, as demonstrated by the Millennium

8 Youth People's Congress that was held in Hawaii in October 1999.

9 Establishing a global youth center in Hawaii is consistent

with the vision statement of International Student/Young

11 Pugwash, an international organization that will be a major

12 contributor to the Center, which aims to address threats to

13 global society from nuclear weapons, nuclear proliferation,

14 international conflict and violence, and other social, economic,

15 and environmental problems that put human security at risk. New

16 tools and methods within an interdisciplinary framework are

17 needed to uncover sustainable solutions.

The purpose of this Act is to establish a global youth 1 center in Hawaii under the University of Hawaii. 2 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 4 5 and to read as follows: 6 "§304A- Global youth center; establishment. (a) There 7 is established a global youth center within the University of 8 Hawaii. The appropriate departments and programs shall 9 collaborate with the center as requested. The global youth 10 center is established for educational purposes that support 11 collaboration linking Hawaii youth with people around the world; promote working together to discover creative ways to develop 12 13 the global future; and shape a more peaceful and healthier 14 earth. The global youth center shall provide an international 15 framework in which youth from around the world may engage in the 16 activities to promote world peace, environmental sustainability, and human and economic productivity for future generations. 17 (b) The global youth center shall support collaboration 18 between Hawaii youth and international youth to empower and 19 20 educate them to: (1) Identify and address pressing major global issues that 21

will directly affect this and future generations;
