A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HISTORIC BUILDINGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, in 1885, when the
- 2 Japanese began migrating to Hawaii to work on the sugar
- 3 plantations, they brought with them a religious tradition that
- 4 is reflected in the architecture of many Buddhist temples
- 5 throughout the State.
- 6 Elaborately decorated Buddhist temples were built as early
- 7 as the 1920s and served as a place to practice and preserve
- 8 Japanese religious and cultural beliefs. Original carvings,
- 9 interior furnishings brought from Japan, and intricate details
- 10 characterized the highly talented architectural work of Japanese
- 11 craftsmen who built these temples.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to preserve the heritage and
- 13 architecture of our State, as reflected in the Japanese-style
- 14 Buddhist temples found throughout Hawaii.
- 15 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the

- 1 refurbishment of each historic Japanese-style Buddhist temple in
- 2 Hawaii.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 accounting and general services through the state foundation on
- 5 culture and the arts for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
