## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, given the problems
- 2 associated with inmate re-entry into the community, as well as
- 3 the high rate of recidivism among the ex-offender population,
- 4 programs that effectively assist in the transition of inmates
- 5 from prison to the community are critical. Once released from
- 6 prison, an ex-offender must deal with various issues, such as
- 7 workplace barriers, housing restrictions, and many other
- 8 informal limitations as a result of prejudice against ex-
- 9 offenders.
- 10 The legislature further finds that a person's time in jail
- 11 or prison costs society from \$70 to \$400 per day, depending upon
- 12 the level of security measures required. These costs can be
- 13 dramatically reduced through the implementation of programs that
- 14 assist with the inmate's post-incarceration community
- 15 reintegration process. For many ex-offenders, education is the
- 16 key to their reintegration into the community.

1	The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the		
2	departmen	t of education adult education program to assist ex-	
3	offenders with successful reintegration into the community, so		
4	as to reduce recidivism, increase productivity, and support them		
5	to become productive, law-abiding citizens.		
6	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general		
7	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so	
8	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to	
9	establish:		
10	(1)	Special classes or programs to encourage and provide	
11		opportunities for an inmate exiting jail or prison to	
12		obtain a general education development diploma in	
13		order to pursue further educational opportunities and	
14		to increase opportunities to obtain employment in the	
15		community;	
16	(2)	A permanent, personalized educational and job	
17		preparation plan for individuals on parole and others	
18		released into the community from jail or prison who	
19		express a desire for additional education to prepare	
20		for gainful employment;	

(3) The assignment of a unique identifier by the

department of education, such as number or code, to an

2	development diploma for the purpose of tracking	g the
3	ex-offender into the workforce or a postsecond	ary
4	educational institution in an effort to assist	the ex-
5	offender in their development and reintegratio	n into
6	the community; provided that the unique identi	fier
7	does not serve the purpose or have the intent	of
8	creating a source of stigmatization against th	e ex-
9	offender; and	
10	(4) A voluntary data tracking system to identify	
11	successful educational components that help ex	-
12	offenders mainstream into the community.	
13	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the depar	tment of
14	education for the purposes of this Act.	
15	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2	008.
