A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CIVIL IDENTIFICATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 2 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 "§46- Civil identification; transfer of functions.
- 5 Beginning January 1, 2009, the functions, powers, duties, and
- 6 authority heretofore exercised by the department of the attorney
- 7 general relating to civil identification under chapter 846 shall
- 8 be exercised by the counties by adoption of an ordinance. A
- 9 county may assess an appropriate fee in accordance with rules
- 10 adopted in accordance with chapter 91."
- 11 SECTION 2. Part II of chapter 846, Hawaii Revised
- 12 Statutes, is repealed.
- 13 SECTION 3. Pursuant to article VIII, section 5 of the
- 14 Hawaii State constitution, there is appropriated out of the
- 15 general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$
- 16 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009
- 17 for each county for costs of implementation, as follows:

5	The sum appropriated shall be allotted by the de	epartment of
6	the attorney general and expended by the respective	counties for
7	the purposes of this Act.	
8	SECTION 4. All rights, powers, functions, and	duties of
9	the department of the attorney general are transferre	ed to the
10	respective counties.	
11	All officers and employees whose functions are	transferred
12	by this Act shall be transferred with their functions	s and shall
13	continue to perform their regular duties upon their	transfer,
14	subject to the state personnel laws and this Act.	
15	No officer or employee of the State having tenus	re shall
16	suffer any loss of salary, seniority, prior service	credit,
17	vacation, sick leave, or other employee benefit or pr	rivilege as
18	a consequence of this Act, and such officer or employ	yee may be
19	transferred or appointed to a civil service position	without the
20	necessity of examination; provided that the officer	or employee
21	possesses the minimum qualifications for the position	n to which
22	transferred or appointed; and provided that subsequen	nt changes



- 1 in status may be made pursuant to applicable civil service and
- 2 compensation laws.
- 3 An officer or employee of the State who does not have
- 4 tenure and who may be transferred or appointed to a civil
- 5 service position as a consequence of this Act shall become a
- 6 civil service employee without the loss of salary, seniority,
- 7 prior service credit, vacation, sick leave, or other employee
- 8 benefits or privileges and without the necessity of examination;
- 9 provided that such officer or employee possesses the minimum
- 10 qualifications for the position to which transferred or
- 11 appointed.
- 12 If an office or position held by an officer or employee
- 13 having tenure is abolished, the officer or employee shall not
- 14 thereby be separated from public employment, but shall remain in
- 15 the employment of the State with the same pay and classification
- 16 and shall be transferred to some other office or position for
- 17 which the officer or employee is eliqible under the personnel
- 18 laws of the State as determined by the head of the department or
- 19 the governor.
- 20 SECTION 5. All records, equipment, machines, files,
- 21 supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents, maps, and other
- 22 personal property heretofore made, used, acquired, or held by



- 1 the department of the attorney general relating to the functions
- 2 transferred to the respective county shall be transferred with
- 3 the functions to which they relate.
- 4 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 6 provided that section 2 shall take effect on January 1, 2009;
- 7 and provided further that section 3 shall take effect on July 1,
