## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE AUDITOR.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that since the passage of
- 2 mandatory minimum sentences for the use, possession, or
- 3 distribution of crystal methamphetamine, Hawaii's prison
- 4 population has dramatically increased. This rise in inmate
- 5 population has caused Hawaii to contract with out-of-state
- 6 private prisons to ease overcrowding.
- 7 The legislature also finds that, in 1996, Hawaii
- 8 transferred three hundred prisoners out of the State, and the
- 9 number of transfers has been rapidly rising ever since. Ten
- 10 years later in 2006, Hawaii had 1,844 prisoners housed in
- 11 private prisons on the mainland. Today, Hawaii has over two
- 12 thousand prisoners serving their sentences in Corrections
- 13 Corporation of America prisons in Arizona and Kentucky.
- 14 The legislature further finds that there has never been an
- 15 audit of the private mainland prisons that Hawaii has contracted
- 16 with to house the State's inmates, despite the fact that deaths

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and serious injuries have occurred at several of the contract
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    prisons on the mainland.
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         The purpose of this Act is to require performance audits of
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    private prisons on the mainland housing Hawaii prisoners with
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    regard to the issues of delivery of services, visitation, and
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    the department of public safety's monitoring of those contracts.
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         SECTION 2. The office of the auditor shall conduct a
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    performance audit of the Saguaro Correctional Facility in Eloy,
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    Arizona and the Otter Creek Correctional Facility in
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    Wheelwright, Kentucky; provided that if the State begins a
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    process of returning all female prisoners, who were previously
    transferred from Hawaii to the Otter Creek Correctional
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    Facility, back to Hawaii in 2009, then the requirement for a
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    performance audit of that facility pursuant to this Act shall be
    withdrawn. Each performance audit shall cover:

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         SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
    revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of $

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         SECTION 4. The auditor shall report findings and
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    recommendations to the legislature no later than twenty days
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    prior to the convening of the regular session of 2009.
