A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COGNITIVE RESTRUCTURING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a 2 disproportionately high rate of arrest and incarceration amongst 3 young men and women of native Hawaiian ancestry. It is 4 estimated that over two thousand persons of native Hawaiian 5 ancestry are incarcerated and that seventy per cent of those persons are between the ages of twenty and forty. 6 7 The legislature also finds that a promising approach to 8 reducing recidivism and helping inmates make the successful 9 transition from prison to the community is through establishing 10 cognitive restructuring and transition programs at correctional 11 facilities. Those reintegration programs involve the self-12 examination of an inmate's belief system, criminal addictive 13 cycle, attitude, and thinking patterns, and they also develop a 14 relapse prevention plan for future situations. Essentially, the 15 program assists offenders with restructuring their thought processes and teaches them cognitive skills that help with basic 16 17 decision-making and problem-solving. The goal of cognitive 18 restructuring is to guide offenders to consciously examine their

- 1 decision-making processes through developing self control, thus
- 2 making them responsible for, and in charge of, their actions no
- 3 matter how stressful the situation. When combined with
- 4 strategies that help native Hawaiian inmates get back in touch
- 5 with the values of their culture; cognitive rehabilitation can
- 6 help break the vicious cycle of crime and punishment as
- 7 knowledge of native Hawaiian traditions and cultural values have
- 8 helped many cope with social challenges.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to extend the ability of
- 10 department of public safety to expend existing monies and also
- 11 to provide additional funding to establish pilot reintegration
- 12 programs within correctional facilities located in the county of
- 13 Hawaii. The reintegration programs will analyze cognitive
- 14 behavioral theories with native Hawaiian holistic interventions
- 15 to address domestic violence, addictions, self mastery through
- 16 identity, and community connections for successful transitions
- 17 back into the community.
- 18 SECTION 2. Act 3, First Special Session Laws of Hawaii
- 19 2007, is amended by amending section 20 to read as follows:
- 20 "SECTION 20. There is appropriated out of the general
- 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$33,000 or so much
- thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year [2007-2008] 2008-

- 1 2009 for a cognitive restructuring pilot program to be
- 2 established in the county of Hawaii at Kulani correctional
- 3 facility, Hawaii community correctional center, and Hale Nani
- 4 reintegration center.
- 5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 6 public safety for the purposes of this part."
- 7 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much
- 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to
- 10 establish cognitive restructuring programs that use native
- 11 Hawaiian holistic methods in the county of Hawaii at the Kulani
- 12 correctional facility, Hawaii community correctional center, and
- 13 Hale Nani reintegration center.
- 14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 15 public safety for the purposes of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008;
- 19 provided that section 2 shall take effect on June 29, 2008.
