A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PSEUDOEPHEDRINE SALES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 329-75, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a
4	pharmacy or retailer may dispense, sell, or distribute to a
5	person without a prescription not more than 3.6 grams per $\operatorname{day}_{\underline{I}}$
6	without regard to the number of transactions, of any product,
7	mixture, or preparation containing any detectable quantity of
8	pseudoephedrine, its salts, optical isomers, or salts of optical
9	isomers[$_{ au}$] as the only active ingredient or in combination with
10	other active ingredients; provided that the pharmacy or retailer
11	complies with the following conditions:
12	(1) The product, mixture, or preparation shall be
13	dispensed, sold, or distributed from an area not
14	accessible by customers or the general public, such as
15	behind the counter or in a locked display case and
16	where the seller delivers the product directly into
17	the custody of the purchaser; [and]

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1	(2)	Any person purchasing or otherwise acquiring any
2		product, mixture, or preparation shall [+
3		(A) Produce] produce proper identification containing
4		the photograph, date of birth, printed name,
5		[and] signature, and address of the individual
6		obtaining the controlled substance; [and
7		(B) Sign a written log, receipt, or other program or
8		mechanism]
9	(3)	The pharmacy or retailer shall record, in an
10		electronic log approved by the administrator[7
11		showing]: the date of the transaction[τ]; the name
12		$[and]_{,}$ address, and date of birth of the person $[\tau]_{;}$
13		the type of identification provided by the person; the
14		agency issuing the identification used; any unique
15		number associated with the identification; and the
16		amount and name of the compound, mixture, or
17		preparation[+]; and
18	(4)	The information required by paragraph (3) shall be
19		submitted in real time to the electronic log. The
20		information shall be retained by the pharmacy or
21		retailer for a period of two years. The electronic
22		log shall be capable of checking compliance against

1	all state and federal laws, including interfacing with
2	other states to ensure comprehensive compliance, and
3	shall be subject to random and warrantless inspection
4	by county or state law enforcement officers.
5	No person shall purchase, receive, or otherwise acquire more
6	than nine grams of any product, mixture, or preparation
7	containing any detectable quantity of pseudoephedrine or its
8	salts, isomers, or salts of optical isomers within a thirty-day
9	period, except that this limit shall not apply to any quantity
10	of such product, mixture, or preparation dispensed pursuant to a
11	valid prescription."
12	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
13	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
14	begun, before its effective date.
15	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
18	provided that a pharmacy or retailer shall have until January 1,
19	2009, to establish the electronic log required under this Act.
