A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PSEUDOEPHEDRINE SALES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 329-75, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a 4 pharmacy or retailer may dispense, sell, or distribute to a 5 person without a prescription not more than 3.6 grams per day, without regard to the number of transactions, of any product, 6 7 mixture, or preparation containing any detectable quantity of 8 pseudoephedrine, its salts, optical isomers, or salts of optical 9 isomers[7] as the only active ingredient or in combination with 10 other active ingredients; provided that the pharmacy or retailer [complies] shall comply with the following conditions: 11 12 (1) The product, mixture, or preparation shall be 13 dispensed, sold, or distributed from an area not accessible by customers or the general public, such as 14 15 behind the counter or in a locked display case and

where the seller delivers the product directly into

the custody of the purchaser; [and]

1	(2)	Any person purchasing or otherwise acquiring any
2		product, mixture, or preparation shall[+
3		(A) Produce proper identification containing
4		the photograph, date of birth, printed name,
5		[and] signature, and address of the individual
6		obtaining the controlled substance; [and
7		(B) Sign a written log, receipt, or other program or
8		mechanism]
9	<u>(3)</u>	The pharmacy or retailer shall record, in an
10		electronic log on software provided by the narcotics
11		enforcement division of the department and approved by
12		the administrator[- showing]: the date of the
13		transaction[7]; the name [and], address, and date of
14		birth of the person[7]; the type of identification
15		provided by the person; the agency issuing the
16		identification used; any unique number associated with
17		the identification; and the amount and name of the
18		compound, mixture, or preparation[+]; and
19	(4)	The pharmacy or retailer shall record the information
20		required under paragraph (3) on an Excel worksheet on
21		software provided by the narcotics enforcement
22		division of the department and electronically mailed

1	to the narcotics enforcement division once a month.
2	The information shall be retained by the pharmacy or
3	retailer for a period of two years. The electronic
4	log shall be capable of checking compliance against
5	all state and federal laws, including interfacing with
6	other states to ensure comprehensive compliance, and
7	shall be subject to random and warrantless inspection
8	by county or state law enforcement officers.
9	No person shall purchase, receive, or otherwise acquire more
10	than nine grams of any product, mixture, or preparation
11	containing any detectable quantity of pseudoephedrine or its
12	salts, isomers, or salts of optical isomers within a thirty-day
13	period, except that this limit shall not apply to any quantity
14	of such product, mixture, or preparation dispensed pursuant to a
15	valid prescription."
16	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
17	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
18	begun, before its effective date.
19	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
20	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
21	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
22	provided that a pharmacy or retailer shall have until January 1,

- 1 2009, to establish the electronic log using software provided by
- 2 the narcotics enforcement division of the department of public
- 3 safety required under this Act.
