- 1 (3) Give preference to all qualified businesses receiving 2 their first award [in one fiscal year] over multiple 3 award grantees. The development corporation may adopt any other rules pursuant 4 5 to chapter 91 necessary for the purposes of this section. If funds appropriated for the purpose of making grants 6 under this section are inadequate to satisfy all qualified 7 8 requests, the development corporation [shall] may apply for 9 funds to be transferred from the Hawaii capital loan revolving 10 fund to provide the grants in accordance with subsection (b). The amount of any single transfer of funds shall not exceed 11 12 \$100,000, and the development corporation shall transfer the 13 entire amount back to the Hawaii capital loan revolving fund 14 within twelve months of receiving the funds. No more than one 15 fund transfer shall be outstanding at any one time. director of business, economic development, and tourism may 16 17 transfer funds from the Hawaii capital loan revolving fund to 18 the development corporation upon request to carry out the purposes of this section.
