A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CERTIFICATE OF NEED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is effectuate the recommendations of the Maui Health Initiative Task Force 2 established pursuant to Act 219, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, to 3 create procedural efficiency in the certificate of need 4 5 application process by eliminating the statewide health planning council and the review panel, and by renaming the subarea health 6 planning councils to regional health planning councils. 7 SECTION 2. Section 323D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 9 amended by deleting the definitions of "statewide council" and "review panel": 10 11 [""Review panel" means the panel established pursuant to 12 section 323D 42. 13 "Statewide council" means the statewide health coordinating council established in section 323D 13."] 14 Section 323D-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 SECTION 3.

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amended to read as follows:

2 agency. (a) The state agency shall:

- 3 Have as a principal function the responsibility for (1)promoting accessibility for all the people of the 4 State to quality health care services at reasonable 5 cost. The state agency shall conduct such studies and 6 7 investigations as may be necessary as to the causes of health care costs including inflation. The state 8 9 agency may contract for services to implement this paragraph. The certificate of need program mandated 10 11 under part V shall serve this function. The state agency shall promote the sharing of facilities or 12 13 services by health care providers whenever possible to 14 achieve economies and shall restrict unusual or 15 unusually costly services to individual facilities or

Nominations for appointment shall be 6 7 solicited from health-related and other interested organizations, and agencies, including health planning councils, 8 9 providers of health care within the appropriate [subarea,] region, and other interested persons. The members of the 10 11 regional health planning councils shall represent diverse levels 12 of related expertise to ensure comprehensive and sagacious 13 decision making. The members of the [subarea] regional health 14 planning councils shall not be compensated for their services but shall be reimbursed for reasonable expenses necessary to the 15 performance of their function." 16 17 SECTION 12. (a) An applicant for a certificate of need shall file an application 8 9 with the state agency. The state agency shall provide technical assistance to the applicant in the preparation and filing of the 10 11 application. 12 Each application shall include a statement evaluating the 13 facility's or service's probable impact on health care costs and 14 providing additional data as required by rule. The statement 15 shall include cost projections for at least the first and third years after its approval. 16 17 The state agency shall not accept an application for review until the application is complete and includes all necessary 18 information required by the state agency. The state agency 19 shall determine if the application is complete within thirty 20 days of receipt of the application. If the state agency 21

determines that the application is incomplete, the state agency

- 1 shall inform the applicant of the additional information that is
- 2 required to complete the application. When the state agency
- 3 determines that the application is complete, the period for
- 4 agency review described in subsection (b) shall begin, and the
- 5 state agency shall transmit the completed application to the
- 6 appropriate [subarea] regional health planning councils, [the
- 7 review panel, the statewide council, appropriate individuals,
- 8 and appropriate public agencies. The state agency may require
- 9 the applicant to provide copies of the application to the state
- 10 agency, the appropriate [subarea] regional health planning
- 11 councils, [the review panel, the statewide council,] appropriate
- 12 individuals, and appropriate public agencies. If, during the
- 13 period for agency review, the state agency requires the
- 14 applicant to submit information respecting the subject of the
- 15 review, the period for agency review shall, at the request of
- 16 the applicant, be extended fifteen days."
