A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REMOTE DISPENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTIO	N 1. The purpose of this Act is to amend the law
2	governing p	harmacists and pharmacies to permit the operation of
3	remote disp	ensing pharmacies.
4	SECTIO	N 2. Chapter 461, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by	adding five new sections to be appropriately
6	designated	and to read as follows:
7	" <u>§461-</u>	Remote dispensing machine. Drugs dispensed to
8	patients fr	om a remote dispensing machine shall be dispensed as
9	packaged.	
10	The re	mote dispensing machine shall include the following
11	safety feat	ures:
12	<u>(1)</u> <u>S</u>	ecure double-locked cabinets;
13	(2) B	ar-coding or similar technology to identify the
14	<u>p</u> :	roduct in each unit of use container;
15	<u>(3)</u> <u>D</u>	elivery of only one bar-coded unit of use container
16	<u>p</u> .	er dispensation per prescription;
17	<u>(4)</u> <u>T</u>	echnology allowing the unit of use container bar cod
18	t	be scanned upon release of the container from the



1		remote dispensing machine to confirm that it is the
2		correct container, and upon such confirmation,
3		producing a patient-specific label with a bar code
4		that is scanned to confirm that it is the correct
5		label for the prescription; and
6	(5)	A telecommunications and live audio and video
7	,	component allowing the patient to have a face-to-face
8		consultation with a pharmacist of the responsible
9		pharmacy at the time the drug is dispensed.
10	<u>§461</u>	- Remote dispensing pharmacy. Each remote
11	dispensin	g pharmacy shall serve only one responsible pharmacy.
12	The respo	nsible pharmacy may operate more than one remote
13	dispensin	g pharmacy. The following shall be conspicuously
14	displayed	on the premises of the remote dispensing pharmacy:
15	(1)	A copy of the license of the responsible pharmacy; and
16	(2)	A copy of the license of the pharmacist-in-charge of
17		the responsible pharmacy.
18	<u>§461</u>	- Responsible pharmacy. A responsible pharmacy
19	shall be:	
20	(1)	Physically located in this state;
21	(2)	Granted a permit by the board; and

1	(3) Maintain the following records and documentation with
2	respect to the remote dispensing pharmacy:
3	(A) Prescriptions dispensed at the remote dispensing
4	pharmacy;
5	(B) Movement of inventory at the remote dispensing
6	pharmacy; and
7	(C) Policies and procedures of the remote dispensing
8	pharmacy.
9	§461- Remote dispensing pharmacy; operations. (a) A
10	remote dispensing pharmacy shall be secured at all times to
11	prevent unauthorized access.
12	(b) Drugs shall not be dispensed by the remote dispensing
13	pharmacy when the responsible pharmacy is closed.
14	(c) Controlled substances shall not be dispensed from
15	remote dispensing machines.
16	(d) A remote dispensing pharmacy shall be connected via
17	live computer link, video link, and audio link to the
18	responsible pharmacy, and shall use the information technology
19	system of the responsible pharmacy.
20	(e) The pharmacist-in-charge of the responsible pharmacy
21	shall supervise the operations of the remote dispensing pharmac
22	and ensure that the remote dispensing pharmacy is in compliance
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1	with all	laws, including rules, governing the practice of
2	pharmacy.	
3	(f)	A pharmacist of the responsible pharmacy shall:
4	(1)	Maintain visual oversight and continuous surveillance
5		of the remote dispensing pharmacy when the remote
6		dispensing pharmacy is in operation;
7	(2)	Approve each prescription before it is dispensed to a
8	•	patient at the remote dispensing pharmacy; and
9	(3)	Maintain visual oversight of the final dispensing of a
10		drug to the patient from a remote dispensing machine.
11	(g)	At least one remote dispensing technician shall staff
12	the remot	e dispensing pharmacy. The remote dispensing
13	technicia	n shall offer the patient counseling by a pharmacist
14	for each	prescription to be filled at the remote dispensing
15	pharmacy.	The remote dispensing pharmacy shall maintain an area
16	appropria	te for confidential communications between the patient
17	and a pha	rmacist of the responsible pharmacy.
18	(h)	Each unit of use container dispensed by a remote
19	dispensin	g machine shall have a label affixed to the container
20	that meet	s the requirements set forth in section 328-16 and
21	includes	the address of the remote dispensing pharmacy. Labels
22	shall be	generated at the remote dispensing pharmacy.



1	(i) Reco	ords of prescriptions filled at the remote
2	dispensing pha	rmacy shall be maintained at the responsible
3	pharmacy and s	hall be distinguishable from the records of
4	prescriptions	filled at the responsible pharmacy.
5	<u>\$461-</u>	Responsible pharmacy; duties, responsibilities,
6	and requiremen	ts. (a) The responsible pharmacy shall:
7	(1) Deve	lop written policies and procedures prior to using
8	a re	mote dispensing machine that ensure the following:
9	<u>(A)</u>	The safe and effective dispensing of
10		pharmaceutical products to the correct patient,
11		including ensuring that a prescription drug shall
12		not be dispensed at the remote dispensing
13		pharmacy until a pharmacist of the responsible
14		pharmacy has verified the finished prescription
15		drug using the live computer, video, or audio
16		link;
17	<u>(B)</u>	Patient confidentiality;
18	<u>(C)</u>	That only one prescription shall be dispensed
19		from and labeled by the remote dispensing machine
20		before another prescription is released from the
21		remote dispensing machine;

1	(D)	The physical presence of the patient when the
2		drug is dispensed from the remote dispensing
3		machine;
4	<u>(E)</u>	The safety, accuracy, and security of the remote
5		dispensing machine and remote dispensing
6		pharmacy;
7	<u>(F)</u>	Defined access to the remote dispensing machine
8		and to medications contained within or associated
9		with the remote dispensing machine, including but
10		not limited to policies that assign, discontinue,
11		or change access to the remote dispensing machine
12		and medications; provided that a pharmacist of
13		the responsible pharmacy shall have secured
14		access to the drugs in the remote dispensing
15		machine;
16	<u>(G)</u>	Compliance with all state and federal laws and
17		regulations;
18	<u>(H)</u>	That if a patient refuses the prescription drug
19		at the time it is dispensed, the prescription
20		drug shall be locked in a secured cabinet
21		accessible only to a pharmacist of the
22		responsible pharmacy; and

1		(I) Prop	er inventory control at the remote dispensing
2		phar	macy, including the following:
3		<u>(i)</u>	Only a pharmacist of the responsible
4			pharmacy shall stock the remote dispensing
5			machine;
6		<u>(ii)</u>	A pharmacist of the responsible pharmacy is
7			responsible for maintaining the integrity of
8			the drugs in the remote dispensing machine;
9		<u>(iii)</u>	Drugs for the remote dispensing machine are
10			provided to the remote dispensing pharmacy
11			only from the responsible pharmacy; and
12		(iv)	A reconciliation of the physical inventory
13			of the remote dispensing pharmacy shall be
14			conducted at least annually;
15	(2)	Train all	personnel who operate the remote dispensing
16		machine a	t the remote dispensing pharmacy:
17	,	(A) In a	manner that ensures the competence and
18		abil	ity of all personnel who operate any
19		comp	onent of the remote dispensing pharmacy and
20		the	remote dispensing machine; and
21		(B) With	documentation of such training to be
22		reta	ined by the responsible pharmacy;

1	<u>(3)</u>	Ensure that the remote dispensing machine is stocked
2	÷	accurately and in accordance with the established
3		written policies and procedures, including ensuring
4		that a pharmacist of the responsible pharmacy checks
5		the accuracy of the product supplied for stocking the
6		remote dispensing machine; and
7	(4)	Ensure that entry to the remote dispensing pharmacy is
8		limited to authorized personnel.
9	<u>(d)</u>	The pharmacist-in-charge of the responsible pharmacy
10	shall be	responsible for ensuring the meeting of the
11	requireme	nts in subsection (a)."
12	SECT	ION 3. Section 461-1 is amended by adding six new
13	definition	ns to be appropriately inserted and to read as follows:
14	" <u>"Re</u>	mote dispensing" means the dispensing of drugs by a
15	responsib	le pharmacy at a location other than that of the
16	responsib	le pharmacy through the use of a remote dispensing
17	machine.	
18	"Rem	ote dispensing machine" means a machine that contains
19	unit of u	se drugs for dispensing that is operated using
20	informati	on technologies and connected to the responsible
21	pharmacy :	by telecommunications and live audio and video
22	technolog	<u>у.</u>

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1 "Remote dispensing pharmacy" means the area in an 2 institutional health care facility located in this state that is 3 used exclusively for the storage and dispensing of pharmacy-4 dispensed prescription drugs through the use of one or more 5 remote dispensing machines. 6 "Remote dispensing technician" means an individual who 7 assists the pharmacist in operating a remote dispensing pharmacy 8 by providing services that include technical assistance in the 9 preparation of pharmaceuticals for remote dispensing while under 10 the supervision of a pharmacist. 11 "Responsible pharmacy" means the pharmacy that operates the 12 remote dispensing pharmacy. "Unit of use" means drugs packed in a container in 13 14 separate, one-dose units." SECTION 4. Section 461-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 16 amended to read as follows: 17 "§461-9 Pharmacist in charge; pharmacy personnel. 18 registered pharmacist shall be in personal and immediate charge 19 of the pharmacy and personnel employed in the pharmacy. 20 Temporary absences of the registered pharmacist shall be 21 unlawful except for periods of time and under circumstances as 22 authorized under the rules of the board. During any absence of

- 1 the registered pharmacist, prescriptions may not be filled,
- 2 compounded, or received by telephone and no drugs shall be sold;
- 3 provided that this shall not preclude the sale at those times of
- 4 things that might be sold were the pharmacy a store not subject
- 5 to this chapter. No person other than a registered pharmacist
- 6 or a pharmacy intern under the registered pharmacist's immediate
- 7 supervision shall fill or compound prescriptions except as
- 8 provided by subsection (c).
- 9 (b) No person shall practice as a pharmacy intern without
- 10 having first obtained a permit from the board. The board shall
- 11 adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 defining the functions of a
- 12 pharmacy intern, establishing the requirements to be met by an
- 13 applicant for a pharmacy intern permit, and specifying the
- 14 duration of the permit and the procedures for the immediate
- 15 supervision of the pharmacy intern by a registered pharmacist.
- 16 (c) A pharmacy technician may be employed to assist the
- 17 registered pharmacist under rules adopted by the board pursuant
- 18 to chapter 91 that define the qualifications and functions of
- 19 the pharmacy technician and provide the procedures for control
- 20 and supervision by a registered pharmacist.

1	(d) A pharmacist of the responsible pharmacy shall
2	supervise at all times any remote dispensing technicians at the
3	remote dispensing pharmacy."
4	SECTION 5. Section 461-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	"§461-14 Permits for operation of pharmacy[-];
7	notification of remote dispensing pharmacy. (a) It shall be
8	unlawful for any person to operate, maintain, open, change
9	location, or establish any pharmacy or remote dispensing
10	pharmacy within the [State] state without [first] having first
11	obtained a permit or prior notification from the board.
12	(b) Application for permits and notifications shall be
13	made on a form to be prescribed by the board. Separate
14	[application] applications shall be made and separate permits
15	and notifications issued for each separate place at which is
16	carried on any of the operations for which a permit $\underline{\text{or}}$
17	notification is required.
18	(c) On evidence satisfactory to the board, a permit or
19	notification shall be issued[, provided:]; provided that:
20	(1) [That the] The pharmacy for which the permit or
21	$\underline{\text{notification}}$ is sought is or will be[τ] in full
22	compliance with this chapter and rules of the board;

1	(2)	[That the] The location and appointments of the
2		pharmacy are such that it can be operated and
3		maintained without endangering the public health or
4		safety; and
5	(3)	[That the] The pharmacy will be under the personal and
6		immediate supervision of a registered pharmacist.
7	(d)	[No application] An application for a permit shall be
8	refused [except pursuant to] for noncompliance with this section
9	[and] <u>but</u>	only after notice to the applicant and a full and fair
10	hearing.	
11	(e)	To operate a remote dispensing pharmacy, a responsible
12	pharmacy	shall submit to the board the following information:
13	(1)	A completed form prescribed by the board;
14	(2)	The name, address, and permit number of the
15		responsible pharmacy;
16	(3)	The name and license number of the pharmacist-in-
17		charge of the responsible pharmacy;
18	(4)	The name of the institutional health care facility and
19		the address of the remote dispensing pharmacy;
20	(5)	A floor plan of the remote dispensing pharmacy, which
21		shall indicate the space or location of the remote
22		dispensing machine;

1	<u>(6)</u>	The date the remote dispensing pharmacy will be ready
2		for operations;
3	<u>(7)</u>	A description of the security system;
4	(8)	A description of the computer link, video link, and
5		audio link; and
6	(9)	Photographs of the remote dispensing pharmacy area,
7		including but not limited to the remote dispensing
8		machine, the security system, computer link, video
9		link, audio link, confidential-communications area,
10		and locked cabinet.
11	A re	mote dispensing pharmacy's failure to notify the board
12	in writin	g within thirty days of any changes to the information
13	described	in paragraphs (1) to (9) or failure to comply with
14	this chap	ter shall be considered a violation of this chapter and
15	shall res	ult in disciplinary action against the pharmacist-in-
16	charge an	d the responsible pharmacy.
17	<u>(f)</u>	Permits and licenses issued under this section and
18	section 4	61-15 may be closed upon written request from the
19	holder of	the permit or license. The board shall approve all
20	requests	by the holder for closure of a permit or license. Once
21	the closu	re is approved, the holder of the closed permit or

- 1 license shall be required to reapply as a new applicant to
- 2 conduct business where a permit or license is required."
- 3 SECTION 6. Section 461-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 "§461-16 Fees for permits and licenses; renewal. (a) The
- 6 board shall collect application, license, and permit fees for
- 7 each permit to operate a pharmacy or for each license to operate
- 8 as a wholesale prescription drug distributor and a fee for the
- 9 issuance of a permit in accordance with section 461-15(a)(1),
- 10 (5), (6), and (7).
- 11 (b) Permits issued under sections 461-14 and 461-15 and
- 12 licenses issued under section 461-8.6 shall be conspicuously
- 13 displayed in the place for which the permit or license was
- 14 granted. The permits and licenses shall not be transferable,
- 15 shall expire on December 31 of each odd-numbered year following
- 16 the date of issuance, and shall be renewed biennially.
- 17 (c) The holder of an expired permit or an expired license
- 18 to operate as a wholesale prescription drug distributor may have
- 19 the same restored within three years of the date of expiration
- 20 upon due application therefor and payment of the delinquent fees
- 21 and a penalty fee; provided that in the case of an expired

1 permit, the holder of the expired permit meets the requirem

- 2 for the renewal of permits.
- (d) Permits and licenses issued under sections 461-14 and 3
- 461-15 may be closed upon written request from the holder of the 4
- 5 permit or license. The board shall approve all requests by the
- 6 holder for closure of a permit or license. Once the closure is
- 7 approved, the holder of the closed permit or license shall be
- 8 required to reapply as a new applicant to conduct business where
- 9 a permit or license is required."
- 10 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
