## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REMOTE DISPENSING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many individuals
2	living in underserved or remote areas need improved access to
3	medications and pharmacy services. A remote dispensing program
4	that allows for the dispensing of low-cost medications through
5	the use of a secure remote dispensing machine and patient
6	counseling via a two-way interactive videoconferencing system
7	will help to resolve the dual problem of access to prescription
8	drugs and pharmacists for low-income populations.
9	The purpose of this Act is to permit the operation of
10	remote dispensing machines by a licensed pharmacy or pharmacist.
11	SECTION 2. Chapter 461, Hawaii Revised Statues, is amended
12	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
13	read as follows:
14	"§461- Remote dispensing pharmacy; operations. (a) A
15	remote dispensing pharmacy shall not be operated in any county

with a population greater than one hundred thousand residents or

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1	within a	ten mile radius of an existing pharmacy if the
2	populatio	n is greater than one hundred thousand residents.
3	<u>(b)</u>	A remote dispensing pharmacy shall be under the direct
4	supervisi	on of the registered pharmacist in charge of the
5	responsib	le pharmacy who shall:
6	(1)	Ensure that the remote dispensing pharmacy is in
7		compliance with all laws and rules governing the
8		practice of pharmacy and remote dispensing;
9	(2)	Ensure that the remote dispensing pharmacy is
10		appropriately staffed by a qualified remote dispensing
11		technician; and
12	(3)	Be responsible for the integrity of the drugs in the
13		remote dispensing machine and that drugs for the
14		remote dispensing machine are provided to the remote
15		dispensing pharmacy only from the responsible
16		pharmacy.
17	<u>(c)</u>	Physical set-up. A remote dispensing pharmacy shall:
18	(1)	Be effectively secured to prevent unauthorized access
19		at all times, and entry to the remote dispensing
20		pharmacy shall be limited to authorized personnel
21		only;

1	(2)	Be connected via live computer link, video link, and
2		audio link to the responsible pharmacy and shall use
3		the information technology system of the responsible
4		pharmacy;
5	(3)	Conspicuously display at the remote dispensing
6		machine:
7		(A) A copy of the license of the responsible
8		pharmacy; and
9		(B) A copy of the license of the pharmacist-in-charge
10		of the responsible pharmacy;
11		and
12	(4)	Have a confidential area available for communication
13		between the patient and the pharmacist at the
14		responsible pharmacy.
15	<u>(d)</u>	The remote dispensing technician shall offer each
16	patient c	ounseling by a pharmacist for all prescriptions.
17	<u>(e)</u>	A pharmacist at the responsible pharmacy shall approve
18	each pres	cription before it is dispensed to the patient.
19	<u>(f)</u>	Each remote dispensing machine shall be operated by
20	only one	responsible pharmacy. A responsible pharmacy may
21	operate tl	hrough more than one remote dispensing machine.
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1	(g)	The remote dispensing machine shall have the following
2	features	to ensure that it is appropriately secure at all times
3	and that	all transactions are properly documented:
4	(1)	Secure double-locked cabinets;
5	(2)	Bar-coding or similar technology that effectively
6		recognizes the product;
7	(3)	A cabinet that delivers only one bar-coded unit-of-use
8		container per dispense, per prescription;
9	(4)	A scanner and printer that, upon releasing the unit-
10		of-use container from the remote dispensing machine,
11		the container is scanned to confirm that it is in fact
12		the correct container, and with such confirmation, the
13		printer will print a patient-specific label that also
14		has a bar code that is scanned to confirm that it is
15		the correct label for the prescription; and
16	(5)	A video component that allows the patient to have a
17		"face-to-face" consultation with the pharmacist at the
18		responsible pharmacy.
19	<u>(h)</u>	A pharmacist shall be in charge of the remote
20	dispensir	ng machine and shall ensure that:

1	(1)	ritten policies and procedures are developed prior to
2		asing the machine that:
3		(A) Ensure the safe and effective dispensing of
4		pharmaceutical products;
5		B) Ensure the remote dispensing pharmacy and the
6		remote dispensing machine is operating safely,
7		accurately, and securely; and
8		C) Define access to the remote dispensing machine
9		and to medications contained within or associated
10		with the machine, including policies that assign,
11		discontinue, or change access to the remote
12		dispensing machine and medications;
13	(2)	pharmacist licensed in this state and employed by
14		he responsible pharmacy has secured access to the
15		rugs in the remote dispensing machine;
16	(3)	ccess to the medications complies with state and
17		ederal laws, rules, and regulations;
18	<u>(4)</u>	o prescription drug is dispensed at the remote
19		ispensing pharmacy until a pharmacist at the
20		esponsible pharmacy has verified the finished
21		rescription;

1	(5)	Only one prescription is dispensed and labeled from
2		the remote dispensing machine at a time;
3	(6)	All prescriptions dispensed have a label affixed to
4		the final drug container that meets the requirements
5		set forth in section 328-16 and includes the address
6		of the remote dispensing pharmacy;
7	(7)	If a patient refuses the prescription drug at the time
8		it is dispensed, the prescription drug is locked in a
9		secured cabinet;
10	(8)	There is proper inventory control at the remote
11		dispensing pharmacy and only a registered pharmacist
12		or a technician assigned by the pharmacist in charge
13		of the responsible pharmacy shall stock the remote
14		dispensing machine;
15	<u>(9)</u>	A reconciliation of the physical inventory of the
16		remote dispensing pharmacy is conducted at least
17		annually;
18	(10)	All personnel who operate the remote dispensing
19		machine at the remote dispensing pharmacy are properly
20		trained. Training shall ensure the competence and
21		ability of all personnel who operate any component of
22	0000 1011	the remote dispensing machine and the remote
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1	dispensing pharmacy. Documentation of training shall
2	be kept by the responsible pharmacy; and
3	(11) The remote dispensing machine is stocked accurately
4	and in accordance with established written policies
5	and procedures. The pharmacist shall check the
6	accuracy of the product supplied for stocking the
7	remote dispensing machine.
8	(i) Controlled substances shall not be dispensed from any
9	remote dispensing machine or remote dispensing pharmacy.
10	(j) Drugs dispensed from the remote dispensing machine
11	shall be dispensed as packaged, with no changes to the drug, its
12	strength, or its unit quantity, except for the addition of water
13	for reconstitution of dry powder drugs.
14	(k) Prescription labels for the product dispensed from the
15	remote dispensing machine shall only be generated at the remote
16	dispensing pharmacy.
17	(1) Records of prescriptions filled at the remote
18	dispensing pharmacy shall be maintained at the responsible
19	pharmacy and shall be distinguishable from those records filled
20	at the responsible pharmacy. All responsible pharmacies shall
21	maintain, on-site at the remote dispensing pharmacy and have
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- available for inspection at all times, records and documentation 1 2 of the following: 3 (1) All prescriptions dispensed at the remote dispensing 4 pharmacy; 5 (2) All inventory movement at the remote dispensing 6 pharmacy; and 7 (3) A policies and procedures manual of the remote 8 dispensing pharmacy. 9 This section shall not apply to physicians licensed 10 pursuant to chapter 453." SECTION 3. Section 461-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 12 amended by adding five new definitions to be appropriately inserted and to read as follows: 13 14 ""Remote dispensing" means the practice of dispensing drugs 15 through the use of trained personnel, telecommunications, and information technologies to patients at a remote dispensing 16 17 pharmacy. 18 "Remote dispensing machine" means a device used for 19 dispensing unit-of-use drugs that is operated using information technologies and is located in a remote dispensing pharmacy. 20
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1 "Remote dispensing pharmacy" means the area in an 2 institutional facility, including a federally qualified health 3 center, providing outpatient medical care in any county with a 4 population of less than one hundred thousand residents, by 5 dispensing prescription drugs through the use of a remote 6 dispensing machine. 7 "Remote dispensing technician" means an individual who 8 assists the pharmacist in various activities specific to the 9 remote dispensing pharmacy. 10 "Responsible pharmacy" means a pharmacy that operates a 11 remote dispensing machine located in this state and holds a valid permit issued by the board pursuant to section 461-14." 12 SECTION 4. The department of commerce and consumer affairs 13 14 shall submit an annual report to the legislature no later than 15 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular legislative 16 session, beginning with the regular session of 2009 and ending with the regular session of 2013. The report shall include 17 18 information on the use of the remote dispensing machines and 19 their financial impact, if any, on local pharmacies within a ten 20 mile radius.

SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.

- 2 and shall be repealed on January 1, 2013.
