A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAIIAN MONK SEAL DAY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The Hawaiian monk seal (Monachus schauinslandi)
- 2 is the only marine mammal whose entire species range lies within
- 3 the United States. It is one of only two endemic mammals found
- 4 in Hawaii.
- 5 On November 23, 1976, it was listed as an endangered
- 6 species pursuant to the Endangered Species Act and it remains
- 7 listed as endangered today. The population of the Hawaiian monk
- 8 seal has been in a twenty-year constant decline and today there
- 9 are approximately only twelve hundred remaining. The majority
- 10 of this population is in the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands,
- 11 while there are an estimated eighty individuals living in the
- 12 main Hawaiian Islands.
- 13 The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration
- 14 Fisheries issued its Recovery Plan for the Hawaiian Monk Seal in
- 15 2007. The plan outlines strategies for the recovery of the
- 16 species and includes an increase in outreach and education to

- 1 develop a culture of co-existence between humans and seals in
- 2 the main Hawaiian Islands.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to designate a Hawaiian monk
- 4 seal day to promote outreach and educational programs regarding
- 5 the endangered Hawaiian monk seal.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 7 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 "§8- Hawaiian monk seal day. The third Saturday of
- 10 April in each year shall be known and recognized as "Hawaiian
- 11 Monk Seal Day"; provided that this day is not and shall not be
- 12 construed to be a state holiday."
- 13 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
