A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the federal
- 2 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (Public Law 108-446,
- 3 reauthorized 2004) governs how states and public agencies
- 4 provide early intervention, special education, and related
- 5 services to infants, toddlers, children, and youth with
- 6 disabilities. The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act
- 7 requires that, to the maximum extent appropriate, children with
- 8 disabilities be educated in the least restrictive environment
- 9 with children who are non-disabled.
- 10 The legislature also finds that including children with
- 11 disabilities in natural settings within their communities helps
- 12 them to develop a higher level of socialization; gain language,
- 13 motor, and cognitive skills; and improve play skills. The
- 14 legislature further finds that the department of education has
- 15 extremely limited opportunities for preschool-age children with
- 16 developmental delays to interact with their typically developing
- 17 peers. The philosophy of including special needs preschoolers
- in learning environments with non-disabled children is supported



- 1 by the Council for Exceptional Children and the National
- 2 Association for the Education of Young Children.
- 3 The legislature further finds that the concept of universal
- 4 design, which is an approach that maximizes usability of
- 5 products, services, and environments for as many people as
- 6 possible regardless of age, ability, or situation, is an
- 7 approach that would benefit Hawaii's preschools. With universal
- 8 design, a minority of students will need "special"
- 9 accommodations.
- The department of education currently has no regular
- 11 education preschool programs that can adequately provide
- 12 opportunities for inclusion. However, the department of
- 13 education has limited partnerships with Head Start and private
- 14 preschools to provide opportunities for special needs
- 15 preschoolers to interact with their non-disabled peers. These
- 16 extremely limited opportunities are not sufficient to meet the
- 17 needs of all of Hawaii's preschoolers who could benefit from
- 18 inclusive settings.
- 19 The purpose of this Act is to increase opportunities for
- 20 special needs preschoolers to interact with their non-disabled
- 21 peers.

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated			
3	and to read as follows:			
4	"§302A- Inclusion opportunities for special needs			
5	preschoolers. (a) The department of education quality early			
6	education plan, pursuant to section 302A-410, shall include			
7	opportunities for special needs preschoolers who are between			
8	three to five years old to interact with their non-disabled			
9	peers. The department shall collaborate with parents and			
10	private providers to increase opportunities and implement			
11	classes that include both special education eligible students			
12	and general education students, subject to available resources			
13	and individualized education plans.			
14	(b) A special education eligible student may receive			
15	special education and related services in a private preschool			
16	program that is located on a public school site or in the			
17	community, if the services are required by the student's			
18	individualized education program.			
19	(c) Special education personnel may provide services as			
20	provided in the student's individualized education plan at any			
21	preschool site. Special education personnel may also provide

1	services to general education students in a special education		
2	classroom."		
3	SECTION 3. The department of education and the department		
4	of human services shall consider the following options in their		
5	efforts to include special needs preschoolers in general		
6	education preschool programs:		
7	(1) Increasing and developing methods for increasing the		
8	number of eligible recipients of preschool program		
9	tuition subsidies to enable all parents, including		
10	those of children with disabilities, to access		
11	preschool programs offered by the department of human		
12	services;		

- (2) Executing additional contracts to purchase services for five to six slots per preschool for special needs children to receive special education and related services under part B of the Individuals with Disabilities Act;
- (3) Providing intervention specialist services for students who are unilaterally placed in preschools in the community by their parents;
- (4) Establishing partnerships among private and public
 preschool programs to meet personnel needs, including

1		but not limited to, the hiring of teachers who are	
2		dually certified in early childhood education and	
3		special education, educational assistants, or other	
4		necessary staff; and	
5	(5)	Providing pre-service and in-service training	
6		opportunities for early childhood professionals to	
7		incorporate the concept of universal design in	
8		education to prepare them to teach all children	
9		utilizing an approach that provides learners with a	
10		variety of ways to access and process information.	
11	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the general	
12	revenues o	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so	
13	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to		
14	increase (opportunities for special needs preschoolers to	
15	interact v	with their non-disabled peers.	
16	The s	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of	
17	education	and the department of human services, as appropriate,	
18	for the pu	irposes of this Act.	
19	SECT	ON 5. New statutory material is underscored.	
20	SECT	ON 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
