A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds it has become common
- 2 practice for people to use their wireless phones or other
- 3 devices to send pictures, text messages, and emails. In 2006,
- 4 it is estimated that the approximately 250,000,000 wireless
- 5 phone subscribers in the United States sent nearly
- 6 158,000,000,000 text messages.
- 7 Although it is not known how many of these messages were
- 8 sent or received by people who were operating motor vehicles, it
- 9 is clear that driving while text messaging or texting is a
- 10 growing phenomenon, particularly among younger drivers. Experts
- 11 believe seventy-three per cent of wireless phone subscribers use
- 12 their phones while driving. A Nationwide Insurance study
- 13 estimated that twenty per cent of all drivers send or receive
- 14 text messages, and sixty-six per cent of drivers between the
- 15 ages of eighteen and twenty-four confessed in a Zogby
- 16 International poll that they drive while texting.

- 1 In a recent briefing paper, the National Conference of
- 2 State Legislatures reports that driver inattention is a factor
- 3 in an estimated eighty per cent of motor vehicle crashes and
- 4 sixty-five per cent of near crashes. Each year, driver
- 5 distraction is a factor in as many as 4,900,000 accidents,
- 6 causing 34,000 fatalities, 2,100,000 injuries, and as much as
- 7 \$184,000,000,000 in economic loss.
- 8 The legislature further finds that while it is not clear
- 9 how many of those crashes involved texting or even wireless
- 10 phone use, several high-profile accidents have brought new focus
- 11 to the issue. A teenager who was texting while driving in
- 12 Colorado killed a bicyclist in 2005, and in June 2007, five
- 13 members of a high school cheerleading squad were killed in New
- 14 York when the young woman driving their vehicle lost control
- 15 while allegedly sending a text message.
- 16 Currently, two states specifically prohibit driving while
- 17 texting and at least four other states considered similar
- 18 provisions in 2007.
- 19 The purpose of the Act is to ensure greater safety on
- 20 Hawaii's streets, roads, and highways by prohibiting text
- 21 messaging while driving.

4	" <u>§29</u>	1- Text messaging while driving; prohibition. (a)	
5	Except as	provided in subsection (b), no person operating a	
6	motor veh	icle on a public street, road, or highway shall send,	
7	read, or	write a text message by means of an electronic wireless	
8	communica	tions device. A person does not send, read, or write a	
9	text mess	age when the person reads, selects, or enters a phone	
10	number or name in a wireless communications device for the		
11	purpose o	f making a phone call.	
12	(b)	This section does not apply to a person operating:	
13	(1)	An authorized emergency vehicle; or	
14	(2)	A moving motor vehicle while using an electronic	
15		wireless communications device to:	
16		(A) Report illegal activity;	
17		(B) Summon medical or other emergency help;	
18		(C) Prevent injury to a person or property; or	
19		(D) Relay information between a transit or for-hire	
20		operator and that operator's dispatcher, in which	
21		the device is permanently affixed to the vehicle.	

1	(c) Enforcement of this section by enforcement officers		
2	may be accomplished only as a secondary action when a person		
3	operating a motor vehicle has been detained for a suspected		
4	violation of this title.		
5	(d) As used in this section:		
6	"Electronic wireless communications device" means any		
7	device that provides to users the ability to send or receive		
8	electronic communications, but excluding a voice-activated		
9	global positioning or navigation system that is permanently		
10	affixed to the vehicle.		
11	"Emergency vehicle" shall have the same meaning as provided		
12	in section 291-11.6.		
13	(e) A person who violates this section shall be fined not		
14	more than \$ for each violation."		
15	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.		
16	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
