## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DENTAL CARE.

## RE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII.

	DE II ENVICEED DE THE ELOGICATIONE OF THE DETAILS OF THE VICEE.		
1	SECTION 1. In 2006, the legislature appropriated funds to		
2	the department of human services to restore specific preventive		
3	and restorative dental services for eligible persons twenty-one		
4	years of age or older under the State's medicaid and QUEST		
5	programs. Previously, dental coverage for eligible adults was		
6	limited to dental emergencies. According to a recent department		
7	of health report, each eligible adult can receive specific		
8	preventive and restorative services, including dentures,		
9	equivalent to \$500. However, this does not include coverage for		
10	endodontic care, root canals, crowns, elective procedures, or		
11	periodontal surgery. Further, partial and full dentures often		
12	cost more than \$500.		
13	The purposes of this Act are to:		
14	(1) Expand coverage under medicaid and QUEST to include		

comprehensive dental care coverage for eligible persons twenty-one years of age or older and to appropriate funds to provide the additional coverage;

1	(2)	Require the department of health to establish a one-
2		year pilot program to gather information on hospital
3		dentistry for the developmentally disabled in the
4		county of Hawaii on usage, feasibility, and costs for
5		statewide application and appropriate funds therefor;
6		and
7	(3)	Establish a task force comprising various stakeholders
8		to assist in developing ways to recruit and retain
9		dental care practitioners licensed under chapter 447
10		or 448, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to support the
11		provision of the expanded coverage.
12	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
14	and to rea	ad as follows:
15	" §34	Dental care coverage. The department shall
16	provide c	omprehensive coverage to medicaid and QUEST recipients
17	for denta	l care administered by licensed practitioners under
18	chapter 4	47 or 448.
19	The o	department shall administer this benefit in a manner
20	that meet	s federal requirements which are a condition of the
21	receipt o	f federal funds by the State.

- 1 For purposes of this section, "comprehensive coverage"
- 2 means the dental benefit as defined in the Hawaii state plan for
- 3 medicaid."
- 4 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to
- 7 expand coverage under medicaid and QUEST to include
- 8 comprehensive dental care coverage for persons twenty-one years
- 9 of age or older.
- 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 11 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 4. The department of health shall establish a one-
- 13 year pilot program in the county of Hawaii through which the
- 14 department shall gather information on hospital dentistry for
- 15 the developmentally disabled community in the county of Hawaii
- 16 to determine usage, feasibility, and cost issues for application
- 17 on a statewide basis.
- 18 The department shall submit an interim report to the
- 19 legislature not less than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 20 the regular session of 2009 and a final report, including any
- 21 recommendations and proposed legislation, no later than twenty
- 22 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2010.

- 1 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for
- 4 the pilot program to be established by the department of health
- 5 pursuant to section 4 of this Act.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the dental
- 7 division of the department of health for the purposes of this
- 8 Act.
- 9 SECTION 6. (a) The department of human services shall
- 10 convene a task force composed of various stakeholders, including
- 11 the department of health, the Hawaii Dental Association,
- 12 interested dental care practitioners, at least one
- 13 representative of a federally qualified health center, and
- 14 advocates to assist in developing ways to recruit and retain
- 15 dental care practitioners licensed under chapter 447 or 448,
- 16 Hawaii Revised Statutes, to support the provision of the
- 17 expanded coverage under this Act.
- 18 (b) The task force shall submit a report to the
- 19 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 20 the 2009 regular session. The task force shall cease to exist
- 21 upon the adjournment sine die of the 2009 regular session.
- 22 SECTION 7. New statutory material is underscored.

- 1 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008;
- 2 provided that section 6 shall take effect upon its approval.

Medical Assistance; Adult Dental Care; Appropriations
