## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to correct 1 2 definitions, correct language under general prohibitions, and clarify the minimum age to sell fireworks. 3 SECTION 2. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by amending the definition of "display fireworks" to 6 read as follows: ""Display fireworks" means any fireworks designed primarily for exhibition display by producing visible or audible effects 8 9 and classified as display fireworks or contained in the 10 regulations of the United States Department of Transportation 11 and designated as UN0333, UN0334, or UN0335, and includes 12 salutes containing more than two grains (one hundred and thirty 13 milligrams) of explosive materials, aerial shells containing 14 more than forty grams of pyrotechnic compositions, and other 15 display pieces which exceed the limits of explosive materials
- includes fused setpieces containing components, which together

  exceed fifty milligrams of salute power. The use of display

19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

## Description:

Clarifies what firework activities require a permit to be lawful, the distance that fireworks can be ignited from certain structures, and that minors are prohibited from selling fireworks; amends the definition of "display fireworks". (SD2)
