A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABILITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. During the 2005 special session, the 2 legislature adopted Act 8, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, 3 which created the Hawaii 2050 task force to review the Hawaii 4 state plan and the State's planning process, and required the 5 office of the auditor to prepare and submit to the legislature the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan. In enacting Act 8, the 6 legislature expressed its belief that government is responsible 7 8 for resolving daily and immediate issues and public needs, while 9 providing quidance to assure a sustainable future and outlook. 10 The creation of the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan comes 11 as the State faces a growing number of pressing issues, 12 including the steady deterioration of public infrastructure; lack of affordable housing; continued reliance on a 13 14 service-based economy; vulnerability of Hawaii in a volatile global energy market; possible interruptions in travel and 15 16 critical food supplies; threats to fragile island ecosystems;

and ever increasing numbers of residents and visitors.

- 1 issues all raise questions about the long term limits of growth
- 2 in the State and motivate the need to begin planning and action
- 3 to assure Hawaii's future.
- 4 Addressing and solving issues critical to Hawaii's way of
- 5 life and natural resources requires coordinated community
- 6 efforts to produce comprehensive, long-range planning policies
- 7 and actions. Within that context, the Hawaii 2050
- 8 sustainability task force and plan have revitalized the State's
- 9 long-term planning process to better guide the future
- 10 development of Hawaii.
- 11 There are several existing state agencies and offices, or
- 12 state officer duties and responsibilities, which focus on and
- 13 serve various functions in achieving and maintaining a more
- 14 sustainable future for the State, including the agribusiness
- 15 development corporation, the commission on water resource
- 16 management, the duties and responsibilities of the energy
- 17 resources coordinator, the Hawaii community development
- 18 authority, the land use commission, the office of environmental
- 19 quality control, and the office of planning. Although these
- 20 state agencies and officials strive to develop and set forth
- 21 policies relating to various aspects of sustainability, they are
- 22 each placed under different state departments for administrative



- 1 purposes. Combining these state agencies and certain duties and
- 2 responsibilities under a single state department will enable
- 3 these agencies to unify their sustainability efforts under a
- 4 single administrative umbrella. Thus, establishing a new
- 5 department dedicated to planning and sustainability creates,
- 6 clarifies, and concentrates the State's long-range planning and
- 7 sustainability initiatives, policies, and efforts by using
- 8 existing agencies and offices rather than creating an additional
- 9 layer of government.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to establish within the
- 11 executive branch of state government a new department of
- 12 planning and sustainability to address issues regarding the
- 13 long-range planning of the State, to coordinate policies and
- 14 actions relating to state planning and sustainability, and to
- 15 provide a comprehensive sustainability agenda for the State.
- 16 PART I
- 17 SECTION 2. Chapter 26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended

- 20 Hawaii community development authority, the land use commission,
- 21 the office of environmental quality control, and the office of

- 1 planning are transferred to the department of planning and
- 2 sustainability.
- 3 All officers and employees whose functions are transferred
- 4 by this Act shall be transferred with their functions and shall
- 5 continue to perform their regular duties upon their transfer,
- 6 subject to the state personnel laws and this Act.
- 7 No officer or employee of the State having tenure shall
- 8 suffer any loss of salary, seniority, prior service credit,
- 9 vacation, sick leave, or other employee benefit or privilege as
- 10 a consequence of this Act, and such officer or employee may be
- 11 transferred or appointed to a civil service position without the
- 12 necessity of examination; provided that the officer or employee
- 13 possesses the minimum qualifications for the position to which
- 14 transferred or appointed; and provided that subsequent changes
- 15 in status may be made pursuant to applicable civil service and
- 16 compensation laws.
- 17 An officer or employee of the State who does not have
- 18 tenure and who may be transferred or appointed to a civil
- 19 service position as a consequence of this Act shall become a
- 20 civil service employee without the loss of salary, seniority,
- 21 prior service credit, vacation, sick leave, or other employee
- 22 benefits or privileges and without the necessity of examination;



- 1 provided that such officer or employee possesses the minimum
- 2 qualifications for the position to which transferred or
- 3 appointed.
- 4 If an office or position held by an officer or employee
- 5 having tenure is abolished, the officer or employee shall not
- 6 thereby be separated from public employment, but shall remain in
- 7 the employment of the State with the same pay and classification
- 8 and shall be transferred to some other office or position for
- 9 which the officer or employee is eligible under the personnel
- 10 laws of the State as determined by the head of the department or
- 11 the governor.
- 12 SECTION 17. All appropriations, records, equipment,
- 13 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents,
- 14 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used,
- 15 acquired, or held by the agribusiness development corporation,
- 16 the commission on water resource management, the energy
- 17 resources coordinator, the Hawaii community development
- 18 authority, the land use commission, the office of environmental
- 19 quality control, and the office of planning relating to the
- 20 functions transferred to the department of planning and
- 21 sustainability shall be transferred with the functions to which
- 22 they relate.

In the interim, every reference to the agribusiness 6 development corporation, the commission on water resource 7 management, the energy resources coordinator, the Hawaii 8 community development authority, the land use commission, the 9 10 office of environmental quality control, and the office of planning in those rules, polices, procedures, guidelines, and 11 other material is amended to refer to the department of planning 12 and sustainability. 13 SECTION 20. It is the intent of this Act not to jeopardize 14 the receipt of any federal aid nor to impair the obligation of 15 the State or any agency thereof to the holders of any bond 16 issued by the State or by any agency, and to the extent, and 17 only to the extent, necessary to effectuate this intent, the 18 governor may modify the strict provisions of this Act, but shall 19 promptly report any modification with reason therefor to the 20 legislature at its next session thereafter for review by the 21

legislature.

- SECTION 21. All acts passed during this regular session of 1
- 2008, whether enacted before or after the passage of this Act, 2
- shall be amended to conform to this Act unless these acts 3
- specifically provide that this Act is being amended.
- SECTION 22. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 5
- and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- SECTION 23. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2010;

provided that section 12 shall take effect on July 1, 2008. 8

Report Title:

Department of Planning and Sustainability; Establishment

Description:

Creates a department of planning and sustainability by combining the office of planning, commission on water resource management, energy resources coordinator responsibilities, agribusiness development corporation, land use commission, office of environmental quality control, and Hawaii community development authority.
