A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR EARLY INTERVENTION SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Children with Down syndrome generally develop
- 2 at a slower rate and have different patterns of development than
- 3 typically developing children. This delay in development means
- 4 that children with Down syndrome will not learn to sit, stand,
- 5 walk, or talk as early as other children. It also means that
- 6 children with Down syndrome may need more repetition and more
- 7 consistency than typically developing children when learning new
- 8 skills.
- 9 The goal of intervention programs for children with Down
- 10 syndrome is to maximize each child's developmental potential and
- 11 improve long-term functional outcomes for the children and their
- 12 families. It is recommended that a "total communication"
- 13 approach (sign language, oral communication, and visual cues) be
- 14 used to help children with Down syndrome develop expressive
- 15 language. Early intervention services provide developmentally
- 16 appropriate activities to maximize a child's cognitive,

- 1 communication, motor, self-help, and social-emotional growth
- 2 until the child is ready for kindergarten.
- 3 The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act of 2004
- 4 gives the State discretion to extend early intervention services
- 5 to children with disabilities who are eligible for services
- 6 under title 20 United States Code section 1419 and who
- 7 previously received services under title 20 United States Code
- 8 sections 1431-1444, until the children enter, or are eligible
- 9 under state law to enter, kindergarten or elementary school, as
- 10 appropriate. The continuation of early intervention services
- 11 for eliqible children with Down syndrome until they are eliqible
- 12 to enter kindergarten will provide continuity of services until
- 13 the child is ready to transition to a special education program.
- 14 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
- 16 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and
- 17 the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 18 year 2008-2009, for the provision of early intervention
- 19 services, as that term is defined under section 321-351, Hawaii
- 20 Revised Statutes, including sign language and other scientific-
- 21 based services, to children diagnosed with Down syndrome who are
- 22 eligible for services under title 20 United States Code section



- 1 1419, and who previously received services under title 20 United
- 2 States Code sections 1431-1444, until the children enter, or are
- 3 eligible under state law to enter, kindergarten or elementary
- 4 school, as appropriate.
- 5 SECTION 3. The sums appropriated shall be expended by the
- 6 department of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
