A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE HAWAII CAPITAL CULTURAL DISTRICT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the No. 1 Capitol 2 District Building (a.k.a. Hemmeter building) is located in the Hawai'i capital cultural district at 250 South Hotel street, 3 4 Honolulu, Hawaii, 96813, and is the home of the Hawaii state art 5 museum (HiSAM), as well as a number of state government 6 agencies. 7 The museum currently occupies 12,000 square feet in three galleries, and amenities include an extensively used 8 9 multipurpose room, a volunteer resource room, a small 10 kitchenette, and leased spaces for the Downtown @ the HiSAM cafe 11 and museum gift shop.

12 The purpose of this Act is to establish a task force to 13 review the current operations of the Hawaii state art museum, 14 and its long range plans for operations and growth, with respect 15 to the museum's location in the No. 1 Capitol District Building 16 (a.k.a. Hemmeter building), located in the Hawai'i capital 17 cultural district.



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1	SECT	ION 2. Hawaiʻi capital cultural district task force.
2	(a) Ther	e is established the Hawaiʻi capital cultural district
3	task forc	e within the state foundation on culture and the arts
4	for admin	istrative purposes only. The task force shall comprise
5	the follo	wing:
6	(1)	Two members appointed by the senate president;
7		provided that one member shall be from the arts
8		community;
9	(2)	Two members appointed by the speaker of the house of
10		representatives; provided that one member shall be
11		from the arts community;
12	(3)	Two members representing museum organizations;
13	(4)	The director of business, economic development, and
14		tourism or the director's designee;
15	(5)	The comptroller or the comptroller's designee; and
16	(6)	A member representing the University of Hawaii's
17		department of art and art history.
18	The director of the state foundation on culture and the arts	
19	shall ser	vice as the chair of the task force.
20	(b)	The task force shall review the current operations of
21	the Hawai	i state art museum, and its long range plans for
22	operation	s and growth, with respect to the museum's location in
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1	the No. 1	Capitol District Building (a.k.a. Hemmeter building),
2	located i	n the Hawaiʻi capital cultural district.
3	The	task force shall consider, but not be limited to:
4	(1)	All relevant information on the first five years of
5		the museum's development and operation, including
6		issues such as inadequate room for ongoing workshops,
7		docent training, and expansion of amenities for the
8		visitor's center;
9	(2)	Planning updates to address the need for storage areas
10		for the cafe and gift shop that were not part of the
11		original planning;
12	(3)	Current and future staffing, both personnel and space;
13	(4)	Gallery space, both temporary and permanent, and
14		storage for works of art not on display;
15	(5)	Additional programming and facilities management space
16		needs;
17	(6)	The tax exempt status of the No. 1 Capitol District
18		Building and how this may impact use of the building;
19		and
20	(7)	Any other issues or concerns that may arise.
21	In r	eviewing these and any other issues that the task force
22	deems app	ropriate, the task force shall consider how the museum
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1	will further enhance the Hawaiʻi capital cultural district as a				
2	cultural tourism destination for visitors and a historical and				
3	educational center for residents, particularly Hawaii's youth.				
4	(c) The task force shall report no later than twenty days				
5	prior to the convening of the regular session of 2009 on its				
6	findings and recommendations.				
7	(d) The task force shall cease to operate on June 30,				
8	2009.				
9	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general				
10	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much				
11	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the				
12	review of the current operations of the Hawaii state art museum,				
13	and its long range plans for operations and growth, with respect				
14	to the museum's location in the No. 1 Capitol District Building				
15	(a.k.a. Hemmeter building), located in the Hawaiʻi capital				
16	cultural district.				
17	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the state				
18	foundation on culture and the arts for the purposes of this Act.				
19	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
