A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHYSICIANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a critical shortage of licensed physicians on the neighbor islands and that 2 access to health care in these medically underserved areas will 3 only deteriorate as the population ages. While it is reported 4 5 that Hawaii ranks eleventh in the nation for physicians per capita, neighbor island residents have limited or no access to 6 physicians, including primary care physicians. According to the 7 state board of medical examiners, of the 4,009 licensed 8 physicians practicing in Hawaii, seventy-five per cent are 9 10 practicing on Oahu. Immediate action is necessary to retain and attract licensed physicians to practice medicine in rural areas 11 on the neighbor islands. 12

A physician's residency generally consists of two to three years of on-the-job training and continuing education after graduation from medical school. Research indicates that physicians tend to establish a practice in the geographic area in which they receive their residency training. The family



medicine residency program at the University of Hawaii John A.
 Burns school of medicine, department of family medicine and
 community health has graduated six board-certified physicians
 each year since 1994. Sixty per cent of these graduates are
 practicing in rural, underserved, or academic family medicine.

Act 277, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, appropriated funds to 6 7 expand the family medicine residency program to create residency 8 opportunities in rural areas on the neighbor islands. A rural 9 family medicine training site was developed on the Big Island 10 last year to rotate medical school graduates specializing in family medicine through Hilo medical center. The goal is to 11 12 further expand the family medicine residency program to include 13 rural areas on Maui, Kauai, and Molokai in the future.

14 By participating in the family medicine residency program, 15 these physicians have already expressed a willingness to serve 16 rural areas and are acquainted with neighbor island residents 17 and facilities. A rural medical practice loan repayment program would encourage physicians to participate in the family medicine 18 19 residency program in the first instance and, upon completion, to 20 establish their practices on the neighbor islands where they 21 received their residency training.



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1 The purpose of this Act is to establish and appropriate funds for a rural medical practice loan repayment program for 2 3 licensed physicians who participate in the family practice 4 residency program and who, upon completion of the family 5 practice residency program, commit to practice medicine for five 6 years in rural areas on the neighbor islands. 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by adding a new subpart to part II to be appropriately 9 designated and to read as follows: Loan Repayment Program 10 11 "§304A-Rural medical practice loan repayment program; 12 (a) There is established the rural medical special fund. practice loan repayment program. The rural medical practice 13 14 loan repayment program shall be administered by the University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine and shall provide 15 eligible loan repayment assistance to qualifying physicians. 16 17 (b) In order to qualify for eligible loan repayment assistance under the rural medical practice loan repayment 18 program, a physician shall: 19 20 Be licensed to practice medicine under chapter 453 or (1)21 460;



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1	(2)	Complete the family practice residency program at the
2		University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine,
3		department of family medicine and community health;
4	(3)	Have an outstanding eligible loan;
5	(4)	Commit to practice medicine for a minimum of five
6		years in a rural area of a county in this State with a
7		population of 500,000 or less; and
8	(5)	Meet any additional requirements determined by the
9		administrator.
10	(c)	The administrator shall determine:
11	(1)	The maximum number of annual qualifying physicians;
12	(2)	The annual eligible loan repayment assistance amount
13		to be awarded to each qualifying physician; provided
14		that a qualifying physician shall not receive more
15		than five years of eligible loan repayment assistance;
16		and
17	(3)	Any additional requirements for a physician to qualify
18		pursuant to section (b).
19	(d)	Nothing in this section shall be construed to create
20	in any phy	ysician a right to any eligible loan repayment
21	assistance	e or any specific amount of eligible loan repayment

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assistance under the rural medical practice loan repayment
 program.

3 There is established a special fund to be known as the (e)4 rural medical practice loan repayment program special fund into 5 which all appropriations, donations, and gifts shall be deposited. The administrator may use any amount of the moneys 6 in the special fund to provide qualifying physicians with 7 8 eligible loan repayment assistance under the rural medical 9 practice loan repayment program. Upon determination by the administrator, the fiscal officer of the University of Hawaii 10 11 John A. Burns school of medicine shall disburse payments to qualifying physicians. The administrator shall submit an annual 12 13 report, including an accounting, to the legislature no later 14 than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session. 15 (f) For purposes of this subpart:

16 "Administrator" means the dean of the University of Hawaii17 John A. Burns school of medicine.

18 "Eligible loan" means any need-based federal, university, 19 or educational loan directly related to obtaining a medical 20 degree as determined by the administrator, except for loans that 21 are eligible for forgiveness or repayment assistance through



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other sources and loans extended by a private individual or
 family member.

3 (g) The administrator shall adopt rules pursuant to4 chapter 91 as necessary to implement this section."

SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for
deposit in the rural medical practice loan repayment program
special fund.

SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the rural medical practice loan repayment program special fund the sum of or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the rural medical practice loan repayment

14 program pursuant to section 2 of this Act.

15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the university of 16 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
provided that sections 3 and 4 shall take effect on July 1,
2008.
