A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE IN RURAL COMMUNITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the limited supply
 2 of physicians and the attractiveness of private practice inhibit
- 3 the efforts of the department of health to provide primary
- 4 medical care in certain rural communities of the State. The
- 5 legislature further finds that, regardless of the amount of
- 6 tuition a student at the University of Hawaii John A. Burns
- 7 School of Medicine may pay for a course of study leading to the
- 8 awarding of a medical doctor degree, the State substantially
- 9 subsidizes the education of these medical school students.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to provide an opportunity for
- 11 physicians who have graduated from the University of Hawaii John
- 12 A. Burns school of medicine and completed their residency, to
- 13 repay their debt by serving in rural communities in the State.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding a new section to part IV to be appropriately
- 16 designated and to read as follows:

3	(1)	Is a graduate of the University of Hawaii John A.

14	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
15	and to read as follows:

5	(3) Has obtained a license to practice osteopathy:
6	(A) Within the State pursuant to chapter 460; or
7	(B) In another state under the laws of another state,
8	shall be required to work in a rural community within the State
9	for a total of two years and shall complete those two years of
10	work no later than years of obtaining a license to
11	practice medicine; provided that the two years of work need not
12	be performed consecutively as long as the person works a total
13	of twenty-four full calendar months. If a person has obtained a
14	license to practice in another state, that person shall first
15	obtain a license to practice in this State under chapter 460
16	prior to working in the State to fulfill the obligations of this
17	subsection.
18	(b) A person subject to subsection (a) who does not comply
19	with subsection (a) shall be fined no more than \$.
20	(c) The board of osteopathic examiners shall adopt rules
21	in accordance with chapter 91 to implement this section."
