A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, in the spirit of
- 2 the public's right-to-know, the disclosure of restaurant
- 3 inspection results creates a powerful economic incentive for all
- 4 types of restaurants to improve public health and safety.
- 5 Consumers deserve to eat in clean and safe establishments.
- 6 Having access to inspection reports online will enable consumers
- 7 to make informed choices for their health and safety. In
- 8 addition, a positive report will create greater economic
- 9 incentives and increase a restaurant's willingness to provide a
- 10 safe and healthy eating establishment.
- 11 The legislature further finds that there are nearly seven
- 12 thousand five hundred food establishments in Hawaii that must be
- 13 inspected every year. The department of health has only twenty-
- 14 six sanitarians island-wide, who are additionally tasked with
- 15 inspecting tattoo parlors, beauty salons, massage parlors,
- 16 laundromats, public pools, and mortuaries. These state
- 17 sanitarians are responsible for an average of three hundred

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- 1 fifty food establishments each, twice the number recommended by
- 2 the United States Food and Drug Administration.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 4 health to publish food establishment violations on its website
- 5 each month, to appropriate funds for a minimum of ten additional
- 6 sanitarians, and to appropriate funds for the enhancement of the
- 7 environmental health services division information management
- 8 system.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 321-4.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- "[+] §321-4.5[+] Inspection of food establishments. (a)
- 12 Inspections of food establishments [may] shall be performed only
- 13 by a registered sanitarian or a food and drug inspector.
- (b) An inspection report shall be issued for each food
- 15 establishment and shall be submitted to the department and the
- 16 owner of the establishment.
- 17 (c) Each inspection report that includes a violation of
- 18 the sanitation rules as established by the department shall be
- 19 posted monthly on the department's website. The owner of the
- 20 food establishment may request in writing one follow-up
- 21 inspection to cure the violation posted. The follow-up
- 22 inspection shall be conducted within thirty days of the receipt



- 1 of the written request on an unspecified date during regular
- 2 business hours. The report shall remain on the website until
- 3 the violation has been cured by a positive inspection report."
- 4 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$620,000 or so much
- 6 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for a
- 7 minimum of ten new sanitarian positions.
- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 9 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$440,000 or so much
- 12 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the
- 13 enhancement of the environmental health services division
- 14 information management system.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 16 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
