## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE STATEMENTS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that members of boards
- 2 and commissions presently file annual financial disclosure
- 3 statements with the state ethics commission that are not made
- 4 public. Some board members are vested with authority to run
- 5 departments, and are thus entrusted with significant policy and
- 6 financial decisions. This Act identifies ten boards and
- 7 commissions whose members file financial disclosures that are
- 8 not released for public review, but who exercise authority
- 9 equivalent to executive branch departments headed by a single
- 10 executive.
- 11 Confidential disclosures keep the public unaware of
- 12 potential conflicts of interest between a board or commission's
- 13 work and their members' personal affairs. While the
- 14 confidential disclosure statements are received and reviewed by
- 15 the Hawaii state ethics commission, the commission is generally
- 16 not aware of the issues that the one hundred fifty or so boards
- 17 and commissions handle on a day-to-day basis. Individuals who

- 1 deal with these boards and commissions are in the best position
- 2 to determine whether board or commission members have conflicts
- 3 of interest. Public disclosure statements are necessary so that
- 4 those who appear before boards and commissions can assure
- 5 themselves that board or commission members have no conflicts of
- 6 interest, or if they do, that they may recuse themselves.
- 7 Public disclosure statements build public confidence in
- 8 state government. While some board and commission members may
- 9 feel reluctant to serve if required to make public financial
- 10 disclosures, the legislature finds that the interests of the
- 11 public outweigh these concerns when such members are charged
- 12 with significant discretionary and fiscal powers.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to make ethics requirements
- 14 consistent between public officials exercising equivalent
- 15 authority and to assure the public that these public officials
- 16 are performing their duties without conflicts of interest.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 84-17(d), Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 "(d) The financial disclosure statements of the following
- 20 persons shall be public records and available for inspection and
- 21 duplication:

21	(7)	The administrator and the assistant administrator of
22		the office of Hawaiian affairs $[-]$ ; and

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1	<u>(8)</u> The	members of following boards and commissions:
2	(A)	The board of agriculture;
3	(B)	The Hawaii community development authority;
4	<u>(C)</u>	The board of trustees of the employees'
5		retirement system;
6	<u>(D)</u>	The Hawaiian homes commission;
7	<u>(E)</u>	The board of land and natural resources;
8	<u>(F)</u>	The land use commission;
9	(G)	The public utilities commission;
10	(H)	The board of directors of the research
11		corporation of the University of Hawaii;
12	<u>(I)</u>	The board of regents of the University of Hawaii;
13		and
14	(U)_	The Hawaii tourism authority."
15	SECTION 3	. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken.	New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 4	. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
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### Report Title:

Public Financial Disclosure Statements; Boards and Commissions

#### Description:

Expands the state ethics code section 84-17(d), HRS, to include members of ten boards and commissions as public officials required to file financial disclosure statements that are open to public review.
