## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC, EDUCATION, AND GOVERNMENT ACCESS ORGANIZATIONS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that on June 16, 2006,
- 2 the state procurement office declared that the department of
- 3 commerce and consumer affairs' contracts for public,
- 4 educational, and governmental access services were required to
- 5 be awarded in accordance with the State's procurement code. In
- 6 response to that determination, the director of commerce and
- 7 consumer affairs ceased the practice of appointing and removing
- 8 members of the boards governing the State's four public,
- 9 education, and governmental access organizations. While state
- 10 law has never provided the director with direct authority to
- 11 appoint board members of public, educational, and governmental
- 12 access organizations, each of these non-profit corporations had
- 13 previously chosen, until recently, to provide the director with
- 14 that authority in their bylaws.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to clarify that the director of
- 16 commerce and consumer affairs does not have the statutory

- 1 authority to select, appoint, and remove members of the State's
- 2 public, education, and governmental access boards.
- 3 SECTION 2. Chapter 440G, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 5 and to read as follows:
- 6 "\$440G- Access organizations; director's authority.
- 7 The director shall have no authority to, and shall not, appoint
- 8 board members of any access organization."
- 9 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
