### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII ENERGY POLICY FORUM.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The Hawaii energy policy forum comprises a 1 diverse group of stakeholders representing the renewable energy 2 industry, electric utilities, labor organizations, oil and 3 natural gas suppliers, environmental groups, and federal, state 4 and local government, including representatives from the 5 neighbor islands. The vision of the policy forum is to develop 6 smart energy solutions to sustain a healthy, prosperous, and 7 secure Hawaii. Its mission is to be a collaborative forum for 8 sharing ideas and information, seeking consensus, recommending 9 and advocating policies and initiatives, and promoting civic 10 action to achieve a preferred energy future for Hawaii. Since 11 its inception in 2002, the policy forum, in cooperation with the 12 legislature and the administration, has led the efforts to 13 initiate a number of improvements to Hawaii's energy laws and 14 policies. It has held a number of informational briefings that 15 have been free and open to the public in its effort to educate 16 17 Hawaii's residents about energy issues.

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A unique feature of the policy forum is its Ten Point Plan:
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    an action plan that identifies specific areas of interest on
    which the forum will focus. It includes specific action items
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    for each point and methods to achieve each goal. As with all
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    the policy forum's outcomes, the Ten Point Plan is determined by
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    a consensus of the policy forum's membership. The policy forum
    updated its ten point plan in August 2007 to take into account
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    the initiatives that have been passed in the years since the
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    forum's inception and the work that remains to be completed.
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         Although much has been accomplished in the past few years
    to position Hawaii as one of the leaders of renewable energy and
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    energy efficiency in the country, there is much more that must
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              The cost of oil has increased substantially during
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    2007, and this is expected to have a profound negative effect on
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    Hawaii's economic well-being. This requires yet more steps be
    taken to reduce Hawaii's dependence on fossil fuels. Therefore,
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    it is imperative that the policy forum continue its
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    collaborative work with all energy stakeholders to ensure that
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    Hawaii has a sustainable, renewable, and affordable energy
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    future.
         The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds so that the
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    Hawaii energy policy forum may continue to implement the vision,

- 1 concepts, and recommendations of the updated ten point plan to
  2 meet Hawaii's energy goals. This will allow stakeholders to
- 3 continue their work from planning to implementation, and it will
- 4 permit further engagement of policymakers, decision-makers, and
- 5 consumers on issues relevant to creating Hawaii's preferred
- 6 energy future.
- 7 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to
- 10 continue the work of the Hawaii energy policy forum for the
- 11 purpose of:
- 12 (1) Implementing the detailed action plans to achieve the
- Hawaii energy policy forum's Ten Point Plan to meet
- 14 Hawaii's energy goals;
- 15 (2) Monitoring energy-related policies and programs to
- 16 continually assess and update tangible goals,
- objectives, desired outcomes, and actions to achieve
- the energy vision and goals of the Hawaii energy
- 19 policy forum;
- 20 (3) Continuing to refine and evaluate benchmarks for
- 21 measuring outcomes of energy implementation
- 22 strategies;

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- 1 (4) Continuing to engage Hawaii's business, government,
  2 labor, and community leaders and integrate them into
  3 the policy activities and discussions of the Hawaii
  4 energy policy forum; and
- (5) Continuing to educate the greater community and createpublic awareness about Hawaii's energy needs.

7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
8 Hawaii at Manoa for the purposes of this Act.

9 SECTION 3. The Hawaii energy policy forum shall submit a 10 report on the updated detailed action plan and timeline to the 11 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 12 the regular session of 2009.

13 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
