## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO IMPORTANT AGRICULTURAL LANDS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 205, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 2 and to read as follows: 3 "§205- Satisfaction of state and county affordable housing conditions on land in the rural district. (a) In lieu 5 6 of satisfying state and county affordable housing conditions or assessments, the landowner may satisfy the affordable housing 7 condition or assessment on land in the rural district within the 8 same county of the project in accordance with section 205-2(c), 9 provided that the landowner provides per cent more 10 11 affordable housing units on such land. 12 (b) No more than per cent of the project's affordable housing condition or assessment may be satisfied on 13 14 land in the rural district." SECTION 2. Section 205-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15
