A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 89C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, provides
- 2 appropriate authorities, including the board of education,
- 3 sufficient flexibility to adjust the wages, hours, benefits, and
- 4 other terms and conditions of employment for employees who are
- 5 excluded from collective bargaining. Under the law, these
- 6 appropriate authorities cannot adjust the wages and other
- 7 benefits that are set by statute.
- 8 Within the department of education, substitute teachers are
- 9 part-time, casual, and intermittent employees who are excluded
- 10 from collective bargaining.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to provide for periodic wage
- 12 adjustments for substitute teachers that are comparable to the
- 13 wage adjustments negotiated for teachers in bargaining unit (5)
- 14 and to enable the board of education to adjust the hours,
- 15 benefits, and other terms and conditions of employment for
- 16 substitute teachers.
