A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEACHERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in 2007, the
- 2 legislature adopted Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 56, S.D. 1,
- 3 which requested the Hawaii educational policy center to report
- 4 on the retention and change in assignment of teachers within the
- 5 department of education. Pursuant to its study, the Hawaii
- 6 educational policy center made several findings and
- 7 recommendations to the legislature, including that the
- 8 information necessary to develop a teacher workforce strategic
- 9 plan, as requested in the resolution, is currently unavailable
- 10 because sufficient data has not been collected annually and
- 11 consistently from all stakeholders.
- 12 The legislature further finds that the Hawaii educational
- 13 policy center recommended that the legislature convene a teacher
- 14 workforce strategic planning committee to develop, adopt, adapt,
- 15 track, and evaluate the implementation of a strategic teacher
- 16 workforce development plan for the State.

1 The purpose of this Act is to establish the teacher workforce strategic planning committee and provide funding 2 therefor. 3 SECTION 2. (a) There is established the teacher workforce 4 strategic planning committee within the University of Hawaii. 5 6 The teacher education coordinating committee shall provide administrative, technical, and clerical support to the 7 committee. 8 9 (b) The teacher workforce strategic planning committee 10 shall consist of nine members, without regard to section 26-34, 11 Hawaii Revised Statutes, as follows: 12 The superintendent of education or the (1)superintendent's designee; 13 14 (2) The chair of the Hawaii teacher standards board, or the chair's designee; 15 (3) One representative from the University of Hawaii at 16 Manoa college of education; 17 (4) One representative from the University of Hawaii at 18 19 Hilo education department; (5) One representative from the University of Hawaii, West 20 Oahu campus division of social services; 21

14	expenses,	incurred in the performance of their duties under this
15	Act. Any	member of the task force shall be immune from civil
16	liability	, as provided for under section 26-35.5, Hawaii Revised
17	Statutes.	
18	(d)	The teacher workforce strategic planning committee

20	(1)	Develop, adopt, adapt, track, and evaluate the

(2)	Develop an affordable, easily implemented, multi-
	agency teacher data system to identify and track
	teacher candidates through the educational,
	employment, and professional development pipeline.
	The system should collect timely and ongoing data to
	assist policymakers in making decisions and in
	identifying important trends or patterns that inform
	and improve targeted teacher recruitment, hiring,
	retention, professional support and development, and
	premature retirement or departure rates. The system
	should also contemplate the need for the transfer of
	appropriate data, with protocols to protect individual
	privacy; and

(3) Conduct research on the development and implementation of detailed entrance and exit surveys from institutions of higher education that match student and employee dispositions and experiences with the size, type, and culture of the school to which they were assigned. Research should also focus on why teachers decide to enter the workforce, reasons for transferring from school to school, and factors influencing teachers to leave teaching.

- 1 (e) The teacher workforce strategic planning committee
- 2 shall submit its findings and recommendations, including
- 3 proposed legislation, if necessary, to the legislature no later
- 4 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session
- 5 of 2009.
- 6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for
- 9 the teacher workforce strategic planning committee established
- 10 pursuant to this Act.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 12 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008, and
- 14 shall be repealed on June 30, 2009.
