## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TEACHER STANDARDS BOARD.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, since July 2002,
3	the Hawaii teacher standards board has been licensing teachers
4	and approving teacher preparation programs. The Hawaii teacher
5	standards board has worked in collaboration with teacher
6	preparation programs, schools, agencies, and the department of
7	education to improve the quantity and quality of teachers in the
8	State, as well as the quantity and quality of necessary and
9	relevant data that is accessible to all parties.
10	In 2007, the confirmation process for nominations to the
11	Hawaii teacher standards board became an issue. Questions
12	regarding the appropriate entities to make recommendations to
13	the governor under the law and specifying or clarifying those
14	constituencies to be represented, including their size, require
15	the legislature's attention to ensure effective operations of
16	the Hawaii teacher standards board through proper representation
17	of interested parties. Efforts to address the process have been

- undertaken through a collaborative effort by the interested 1 parties, including the Hawaii teacher standards board, to refine 2 3 the current system. 4 The purpose of this Act is to make necessary changes to the 5 membership and nomination process for, provide necessary funding for increased information accessibility for, and increase 6 7 accountability of the Hawaii teacher standards board. PART II 8 9 SECTION 2. The purpose of this part is to: Increase the number of teaching professionals on the 10 (1)Hawaii teacher standards board; 11 Define "teachers regularly engaged in teaching"; and (2) 12 (3) Clarify those organizations that may nominate 13 14 candidates for membership on the Hawaii teacher standards board. 15 SECTION 3. Section 302A-801, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 17 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 18 "(a) There is established the Hawaii teacher standards 19 board, which shall be placed within the department for administrative purposes only. The board shall consist of 20 [thirteen] fourteen members, including not [less] fewer than 21 [six] seven licensed teachers regularly engaged in teaching, 22
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- 1 three educational officers, the chairperson of the board of
- 2 education or the chairperson's designee, the superintendent or
- 3 the superintendent's designee, a representative of independent
- 4 schools, and the dean of the University of Hawaii college of
- 5 education or the dean's designee; provided that the dean's
- 6 designee shall be chosen from the member institutions of the
- 7 teacher education coordinating committee established under
- 8 section [4]304A-1202[+]. For purposes of this section,
- 9 "teachers regularly engaged in teaching" shall mean teachers,
- 10 school counselors, and school librarians who are not assigned
- 11 the duties of a school administrator.
- 12 (b) Except for the chairperson of the board of education,
- 13 the superintendent, and the dean of the college of education,
- 14 the governor shall appoint the members of the board pursuant to
- 15 section 26-34, from a list of qualified nominees submitted to
- 16 the governor by [the departments, agencies, and organizations
- 17 representative of the constituencies of the board.]:
- 18 (1) The exclusive representatives for public school
- 19 teachers and school administrators;
- 20 (2) Any national professional organization that represents
- 21 teachers or school administrators with a local chapter
- in the State; and

1	(3) The Hawaii Association of Independent Schools for the
2	private school teachers.
3	To the extent possible, the board membership shall reflect
4	representation of elementary and secondary school personnel from
5	[all islands.] Oahu and the neighbor islands approximating the
6	proportion of teachers and administrators that work in these
7	areas. The teacher members of the Hawaii teacher standards
8	board shall hold licenses representative of the range of subject
9	matter and levels, elementary, middle, and high school, taught
10	in public schools. The school administrator members of the
11	Hawaii teacher standards board shall be administrators assigned
12	to elementary, middle, and high schools."
13	PART III
14	SECTION 4. Over the past several years, the board has been
15	developing an electronic licensing system that has the
16	capability of interfacing with public and private Hawaii teacher
17	education institutions and the department of education to share
18	information about licensed teachers. The system also has the
19	capacity to receive data from these same institutions and
20	agencies in a new way that expedites operations as well as
21	avoids the need for duplicative collection of data by multiple
22	institutions and agencies. This sharing of information will

- 1 enable all parties to expedite the performance of their duties
- 2 and responsibilities.
- 3 The data-sharing effort has three facets: (1) technology;
- 4 (2) functionality; and (3) project management and coordination.
- 5 The Hawaii teacher standards board uses SOAP-based web services
- 6 as the technology base for the interface between its network
- 7 partners, and there is a need for all parties to implement SOAP-
- 8 based web services or install turnkey
- 9 hardware/software/communications translation solutions to
- 10 interface partners' existing systems to the information network
- 11 without change to those systems.
- The legislature further finds that, over the next several
- 13 months, the participating organizations will work to agree on
- 14 the list of transactions that each will be prepared to service
- 15 and originate. These transactions shall include all information
- 16 that each participating institution or agency, including the
- 17 department of education, stores in its automated system that may
- 18 support teacher licensing, re-licensing, teacher education, and
- 19 hiring, including but not limited to license information for any
- 20 current licensees, license application information for any
- 21 applicant, state-approved teacher education program completer
- 22 information, university course completion information for any

1 licensee, higher education degree information, teacher 2 employment and work site information, teacher termination, 3 resignation, retirement, and leave status. 4 The purpose of this part, based on the support of the 5 teacher education coordinating committee, is to authorize the Hawaii teacher standards board to coordinate an effort to create 6 7 a network incorporating the teacher education institutions and 8 the department of education in order to support the free 9 interchange of information valuable to all of the participating 10 organizations. Further, it is the purpose of this part to 11 provide funds to achieve this interchange. 12 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 14 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for 15 the purposes of this part; provided that: An assessment of available internal resources and 16 (1)17 additional resources required shall be used to 18 determine the funding needed to implement this part; 19 and 20 (2) In consultation with the participating organizations, the Hawaii teacher standards board shall use and 21 22 disburse the funds to the network partners in a manner

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              that responds to the organizations' needs and
              circumstances while aiming to meet the purposes of
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              this part.
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         The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
    teacher standards board for the purposes of this part.
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                                  PART IV
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         SECTION 6. The purpose of this part is to increase
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    accountability and expand the scope of the information provided
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    by the Hawaii teacher standards board to the legislature and the
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    governor to include information on income and expenditures and
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    to require a summary report with data from the previous five
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    years of the Hawaii teacher standards board's accomplishments
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    and objectives, efforts to improve and maintain teacher quality,
    and efforts to keep its operations responsive and efficient.
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         SECTION 7. Section 302A-803, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
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               In addition to establishing standards for the

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    authorized by law, the board's powers shall also include:
              Setting and administering its own budget;

              Adopting, amending, or repealing the rules of the

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1	(3)	Receiving grants or donations from private
2		foundations, and state and federal funds;
3	(4)	Submitting an annual report to the governor and the
4		legislature on the board's operations, including
5		income and expenditures, and [from the 2007-2008
6		school year, submitting] a summary report [every] with
7		data from the previous five years of the board's
8		accomplishment of objectives, efforts to improve or
9		maintain teacher quality, and efforts to keep its
10		operations responsive and efficient;
11	(5)	Conducting a cyclical review of standards and
12		suggesting revisions for their improvement;
13	(6)	Establishing licensing fees in accordance with chapter
14		91, including the collection of fees by means of
15		mandatory payroll deductions, which shall subsequently
16		be deposited into the state treasury and credited to
17		the Hawaii teacher standards board special fund;
18	(7)	Establishing penalties in accordance with chapter 91;
19	(8)	Issuing, renewing, revoking, suspending, and
20		reinstating licenses;
21	(9)	Reviewing reports from the department on individuals
22		hired on an emergency basis;

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1	(10)	Applying licensing standards on a case-by-case basis
2		and conducting licensing evaluations;
3	(11)	Preparing and disseminating teacher licensing
4		information to schools and operational personnel;
5	(12)	Approving teacher preparation programs;
6	(13)	Administering reciprocity agreements with other states
7		relative to licensing;
8	(14)	Conducting research and development on teacher
9		licensure systems, beginning teacher programs, the
10		assessment of teaching skills, and other related
11		topics;
12	(15)	Participating in efforts relating to teacher quality
13		issues, conducting professional development related to
14		the board's standards, and promotion of high teacher
15		standards and accomplished teaching; and
16	(16)	Adopting applicable rules and procedures."

18	SECT	ION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

20	SECT	ION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
21	provided t	that section 5 shall be effective on July 1, 2008;
22	provided i	further that the amendments made to section
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- 1 302A-803(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, in section 7 of this Act,
- 2 shall not be repealed when that section is reenacted on July 1,
- 3 2009, pursuant to section 4 of Act 263, Session Laws of Hawaii
- 4 2007.

## Report Title:

HTSB; Composition; Nomination Process; Annual Report; Data/Information Management; Appropriation

## Description:

Changes the composition of the Hawaii teacher standards board to include seven licensed teachers regularly engaged in teaching members; defines the term "teachers regularly engaged in teaching"; and clarifies nominating procedures for board members. Appropriates funds for data/information management efforts of the board. Requires the Hawaii teacher standards board to include in its annual report to the governor and the legislature information on income and expenditures and supporting data. (SD1)
