A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The purpose of this Act is to amend the law	
2	relating	to the candidate advisory council for the board of	
3	regents o	f the University of Hawaii in conformity with the	
4	amendment to article X, section 6 of the Hawaii State		
5	Constitution, ratified by the voters on November 7, 2006.		
6	Specifica	lly, this Act:	
7	(1)	Requires the submission of candidates for the board of	
8		regents within sixty days following written	
9		notification from the governor of a vacancy due to	
10		resignation, death, or removal by the governor;	
11	(2)	Requires the council to submit the names of candidates	
12		for the board of regents to the governor;	
13	(3)	Makes confidential all candidate advisory council	
14		information before and after decision making;	
15	(4)	Requires that candidates for the board of regents	
16		reside in the geographic areas that they represent;	

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1 (5) Requires the governor to notify the candidate advisory council for the board of regents of vacancies on the 2 3 board of regents in a timely manner; and (6) Authorizes an administrator position to be established 4 to support the candidate advisory council and provides for an 5 6 appropriation from general funds to support candidate advisory 7 council operations. SECTION 2. Section 26-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 9 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 10 "(a) The University of Hawaii shall be headed by an 11 executive board to be known as the board of regents. 12 The board shall consist of fifteen members. At least one 13 member shall be a University of Hawaii student at the time of the initial appointment. This member may be reappointed for one 14 additional term even though the member may no longer be a 15 student at the time of reappointment. The governor shall reduce 16 the terms of those initially appointed to each seat on the board 17 of regents to provide, as far as practicable, for the expiration 18 of three terms each year; provided that the term of the student 19 20 member shall not be reduced.

At least twelve members, except for the student member, 1 2 shall represent and reside in the specified geographic areas as 3 follows: Two members from the county of Hawaii; 4 (1)5 (2) Two members from the county of Maui; One member from the county of Kauai; and 6 (3) 7 Seven members from the city and county of Honolulu. (4) The board shall have the power, in accordance with the 8 9 Constitution of the State and with law, to formulate policy and to exercise control over the university through its executive 10 officer, the president of the university. The board shall have 11 12 exclusive jurisdiction over the internal organization and 13 management of the university." SECTION 3. Section 304A-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended to read as follows: 15 "§304A-104 Regents; appointment; tenure; qualifications; 16 meetings. (a) The affairs of the university shall be under the 17 18 general management and control of the board of regents consisting of fifteen members who shall be appointed and may be 19 removed by the governor. Except as otherwise provided by law, 20 21 state officers shall be eligible for appointment and membership. The term of each member shall be five years, except as provided 22 SB2668 SD2 LRB 08-2240.doc

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1 for the initial appointment in section 26-11; provided that the 2 term of the student member shall be two years. Every member may 3 serve beyond the expiration date of the member's term of 4 appointment until the member's successor has been appointed by the governor and confirmed by the senate in accordance with 5 6 article X, section 6 of the state constitution. Members shall 7 serve no more than two consecutive five-year terms; provided that the members who are initially appointed to terms of two 8 9 years or less pursuant to section 26-11(a) may be reappointed to 10 two ensuing five-year terms. If a member is to be appointed to 11 a second term of five years, the senate shall consider the 12 question of whether to reconfirm the member at least one hundred 13 twenty days prior to the conclusion of a member's first five-14 year term; provided that if the senate is not in session within 15 one hundred twenty days prior to the conclusion of the member's 16 first five-year term, the member shall continue to serve until 17 the senate convenes for the next regular session or the next 18 special session for which the senate is authorized to consider 19 the question of reconfirmation.

20 (b) At its first meeting after June 30, the board of
21 regents shall elect a chairperson and vice-chairperson, who
22 shall serve until adjournment of its first meeting after June 30 SB2668 SD2 LRB 08-2240.doc



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1 of the next year or thereafter until their successors are 2 appointed. The board shall appoint a secretary, who shall not 3 be a member of the board. The president of the university shall 4 act as executive officer of the board. From May 1, 2007 and 5 until such time that the board of regents has at least fourteen 6 members, seven members of the board of regents shall constitute 7 a quorum to conduct business, and the concurrence of at least 8 seven members of the board of regents shall be necessary to make 9 any action of the board of regents valid; provided that upon 10 filling at least fourteen of the fifteen board of regents seats 11 required under subsection (a), a majority of the board of 12 regents shall constitute a quorum to conduct business, and the 13 concurrence of a majority of all the members to which the board 14 of regents is entitled shall be necessary to make any action of 15 the board of regents valid. The board shall meet at least ten 16 times annually and, from time to time, may meet in each of the 17 counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai.

18 (c) The governor shall notify the regents candidate
19 advisory council within ten days of receiving notification that
20 a member of the board of regents is resigning, has died, or is
21 being removed by the governor.

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[(c)] <u>(d)</u> The members of the board of regents shall serve
 without pay but shall be entitled to their travel expenses
 within the State when attending meetings of the board or when
 actually engaged in business relating to the work of the board."
 SECTION 4. Section 304A-104.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

7 "[+]§304A-104.5[] Candidate] Regents candidate advisory 8 council for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii. 9 There is established the regents candidate advisory council (a) for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii to present 10 to the governor pools of qualified candidates from which the 11 12 members of the board of regents shall be nominated and, by and 13 with the consent of the senate, appointed by the governor. The 14 regents candidate advisory council shall establish the criteria 15 for qualifying, screening, and presenting to the governor 16 candidates for membership on the board of regents. The regents 17 candidate advisory council shall be attached to the University of Hawaii for administrative purposes. 18

19 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), within sixty
20 days of convening its first meeting, the <u>regents</u> candidate
21 advisory council shall present no fewer than two and no more
22 than four qualified candidates to the governor for each vacant
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seat on the board of regents that has arisen due to resignation, 1 2 death, or removal by the governor; provided that for all subsequent presentations to the governor, the regents candidate 3 advisory council shall present no fewer than two and no more 4 than four candidates for each seat on the board of regents to 5 6 the governor within: 7 [Thirty] Sixty days of a vacancy that arises by (1)8 resignation, death, or removal by the governor; or One hundred twenty days prior to the expiration of a 9 (2) 10 term. When there are multiple seats vacant within the same 11 (C) county or within the at-large membership, the regents candidate 12 advisory council shall present candidates for seats on the board 13 14 of regents to the governor as follows: 15 (1) For two seats from the same county or two at-large seats, no fewer than four and no more than six 16 17 candidates; (2) For three seats from the same county, no fewer than 18 five and no more than eight candidates; and 19 For more than three seats, the regents candidate 20 (3) 21 advisory council shall determine appropriate minimum 22 numbers of candidates, which shall provide for at

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1		least three candidates for the final seat, and maximum
2		numbers of candidates.
3	(d)	In making its presentations, the regents candidate
4	advisory	council shall:
5	(1)	Develop a statement that includes the selection
6		criteria to be applied and a description of the
7		responsibilities and duties of a member of the board
8		of regents and distribute this statement to potential
9		candidates;
10	(2)	Screen and qualify candidates for each position on the
11		board of regents based on their background,
12		experience, and potential for discharging the
13		responsibilities of a member of the board of regents;
14	(3)	Publicly advertise pending vacancies and actively
15		solicit and accept applications from potential
16		candidates;
17	(4)	Develop and implement a fair, independent, and
18		nonpartisan procedure for selecting candidates to
19		serve on the board of regents; and
20	(5)	Require each candidate to disclose any existing or
21		anticipated contracts with the University of Hawaii or

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1	any existing or anticipated financial transactions
2	with the University of Hawaii.
3	Upon submission of the names of candidates to the governor,
4	[presentations of] the regents candidate advisory council shall
5	[be made] <u>make</u> available <u>the names of candidates</u> to the public
6	[by] <u>through</u> the University of Hawaii.
7	(e) For each board seat to be filled, the governor shall
8	select one nominee from among the candidates submitted by the
9	regents candidate advisory [council's presentations.] council.
10	(f) The regents candidate advisory council shall consist
11	of seven members to be appointed without regard to section 26-34
12	as follows:
13	(1) One member shall be appointed by the president of the
14	senate;
15	(2) One member shall be appointed by the speaker of the
16	house of representatives;
17	(3) One member shall be appointed by the governor;
18	(4) One member shall be appointed by one of the co-chairs
19	of the All Campus Council of Faculty Senate Chairs of
20	the University of Hawaii;

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(5) One member shall be appointed by the chairperson of 1 2 the Executive Council of the University of Hawaii 3 Student Caucus; 4 (6) One member shall be appointed by the chairperson of 5 the Association of Emeritus Regents; and One member shall be appointed by the president of the 6 (7)7 University of Hawaii Alumni Association; provided that members appointed under paragraphs (4) to (7) 8 9 shall be selected from the general public and may include 10 members of the constituencies represented; provided further that 11 each appointee satisfies the requirements for appointment 12 provided in this subsection, except that individuals who are or 13 have served as members of the executive councils or boards for 14 the organizations under paragraphs (4) [and] or (5) within the 15 last five years immediately preceding the establishment or a 16 vacancy on the regents candidate advisory council for which the 17 persons may be qualified to fill shall not be eliqible to serve 18 as members of the regents candidate advisory council. 19 The regents candidate advisory council shall be selected in a wholly nonpartisan manner. If any member has not been 20 21 appointed within one hundred eighty days of [the] May 1, 2007, 22 the sitting members on the regents candidate advisory council SB2668 SD2 LRB 08-2240.doc 10

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1 shall make an interim appointment to fill the vacant seat. The 2 interim appointee shall satisfy the requirements for appointment provided in this subsection and shall serve until the time when 3 4 the appropriate appointing authority makes an appointment for 5 the vacant seat as provided in this subsection. Appointees to the regents candidate advisory council shall have a general 6 7 understanding of the purposes of higher education. the mission of the University of Hawaii system, and the responsibilities of 8 9 the board of regents. Appointees shall be individuals who are widely viewed as having placed the broad public interest ahead 10 11 of special interests, having achieved a high level of prominence 12 in their respective professions, and being respected members of 13 the community.

14 Members of the regents candidate advisory council (q) shall serve four-year terms; provided that the three members 15 initially appointed by the governor, the president of the 16 17 senate, and the speaker of the house of representatives shall serve for terms of two years; provided further that terms for 18 19 appointments of the initial members of the regents candidate 20 advisory council shall be deemed to begin on July 1, 2007, 21 regardless of the actual date of appointment.


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(h) If a vacancy occurs, a successor shall be appointed in
 the same manner and subject to the same qualifications as the
 person's predecessor. The person appointed to fill a vacancy
 shall serve for the remainder of the term of the person's
 predecessor.

6 (i) The <u>regents</u> candidate advisory council shall operate
7 in a wholly nonpartisan manner. No individual, while a member
8 of the <u>regents</u> candidate advisory council, shall run for or hold
9 any elected office under the United States or the State or any
10 of its political subdivisions.

The regents candidate advisory council shall convene 11 (i) its first meeting on or after thirty-one days from May 1, 2007; 12 13 provided that, if thirty days after May 1, 2007, all the members to which the regents candidate advisory council is entitled have 14 15 not yet been appointed, the regents candidate advisory council shall convene its first meeting upon the appointment of a 16 17 majority of its members. The members of the regents candidate 18 advisory council shall choose a chairperson from among 19 themselves. A majority of all the members to which the regents candidate advisory council is entitled shall constitute a quorum 20 21 to conduct business. The concurrence of a majority of all the members to which the regents candidate advisory council is 22



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entitled shall be necessary to make any action of the regents 1 2 candidate advisory council valid. The regents candidate advisory council shall meet annually and at other times as 3 4 necessary. The regents candidate advisory council shall be 5 exempt from part I of chapter 92. 6 Members of the regents candidate advisory council (k)7 shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for 8 expenses, including travel, board, and lodging expenses, 9 necessary for the performance of their duties. Notwithstanding chapter 92F or any other law to the 10 (1)contrary, all information required by the regents candidate 11 advisory council shall be confidential, including, without 12 13 limitation, all council information obtained, reviewed, or 14 considered before and after council decisionmaking. 15 Confidential regents candidate advisory council information shall include documents, data, or other information that are not 16 17 of public record, including, without limitation, personal financial information; the names of applicants; applications and 18 19 the personal, financial, and other information contained therein 20 submitted by the applicants to the regents candidate advisory council; interviews; schedules; reports; studies; background 21 22 checks; credit reports; surveys and reports prepared for or on



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1	the regents candidate advisory council's behalf; the results of
2	any evaluations or assessments conducted by the regents
3	candidate advisory council; the substance and details of any
4	discussions with regents candidate advisory council members; and
5	the substance and details of discussions and deliberations of
6	the regents candidate advisory council and any of its committees
7	during meetings."
8	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
9	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
10	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to
11	establish a permanent administrative position for the regents
12	candidate advisory council.
13	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
14	Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
15	SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
18	provided that section 5 shall be effective on July 1, 2008.



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Report Title:

UH; Regents Candidate Advisory Council; Appropriation

Description:

Requires the submission of candidates' names for the regents candidate advisory council within 60 days following the notification of a vacancy. Clarifies the requirement of the submission of the names of the candidates to the governor. Makes confidential certain information received or maintained by the regents candidate advisory council; provided that information concerning an applicant that is subsequently appointed by the governor to the board of regents shall be disclosed as provided by law. Requires candidates to reside in the geographic area which the candidate represents. Appropriates funds for an administrative position to support regents candidate advisory council operations. Requires the governor to notify the regents candidate advisory council of vacancies on the board of regents in a timely manner. (SB2668 SD2)
