A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that pursuant to Act 219, 2 Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, a two-tier junior kindergarten and 3 kindergarten program was established with the requirement that developmentally appropriate curriculum be implemented for each The program to be established was intended to be flexible 5 6 enough to allow junior kindergarten students who are ready to participate in kindergarten to do so and to allow students who 7 require additional support to move from kindergarten to junior 8 9 kindergarten. The department of education was tasked with 10 assisting the schools in the development of the two-tier program with pilot strategies being encouraged during the 2005-2006 11 12 school year and full implementation being required beginning 13 with the 2006-2007 school year. It was the legislature's intent to provide for a curriculum 14 15 with appropriately differentiated teaching strategies for all 16 junior kindergarteners and kindergarteners that specifically

addressed the needs of junior kindergarteners, as children of

- 1 ages four and five possess differing skill sets and social and 2 emotional maturity levels. 3 The purpose of this Act is to: 4 Require developmentally appropriate assessments of (1)5 junior kindergarten and kindergarten students; Establish a curriculum with appropriately 6 (2) differentiated teaching strategies for all junior 7 kindergarteners and kindergarteners for the junior 8 9 kindergarten program; 10 (3) Require the department of education to staff junior kindergartens with qualified teachers with early 11 childhood education backgrounds and experience; 12 Require the development and incorporation of the 13 (4)14 Hawaii preschool content standards for four-year olds and the Hawaii content and performance standards for 15 five year olds; and 16 17 (5) Appropriate funds for the implementation of a junior 18 kindergarten program that achieves a student to 19 teacher ratio of ten-to-one and not greater than fifteen-to-one. 20 SECTION 2. (a) The department shall establish and maintain junior kindergartens and kindergartens with a 3 4 program of instruction as a part of the public school system; 5 provided that: (1) Attendance shall not be mandatory; and 6 (2) Charter schools shall be excluded from mandatory 7 8 participation in the program. 9 The department shall establish a two-tier junior (b) kindergarten and kindergarten program to support the range of 10 developmental abilities of children in junior kindergarten and 11 kindergarten. [Any school may move] All schools shall base 12 13 decisions about moving students between junior kindergarten and kindergarten [as the school deems appropriate. Junior 14 kindergarten students may graduate directly to grade one.] on 15 developmentally appropriate assessments. The assessment process 16 shall include academic, social, physical, and emotional domains. 17 18 The assessment process shall include the gathering of information from parents, teachers, and related services 19 personnel who have direct knowledge of the child. 1 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for implementation of the junior kindergarten program as established 4 5 pursuant to this Act that endeavors to achieve a student to 6 teacher ratio of ten-to-one and not greater than fifteen-to-one. 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 8 education for the purposes of this Act. SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 9

and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.

Description:

Requires developmentally appropriate assessments; ensures that a separate curriculum is established for the junior kindergarten program; requires the department of education to staff junior kindergartens with qualified preschool teachers and preschool teacher aides; and appropriates funds for the implementation of a junior kindergarten program that achieves a student to teacher ratio of 10:1 and not more than 15:1.
