A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in the last fifteen
- 2 years, noise levels have risen six-fold in major cities
- 3 throughout the United States. For many communities, noise
- 4 generated by highway traffic not only creates environmental
- 5 problems for residents, but can also have a negative impact on
- 6 student learning. As the number of cars on Hawaii's highways
- 7 increases, highway noise contributes to serious hazards to
- 8 public health and welfare and degrades the quality of life for
- 9 many communities.
- 10 The legislature further finds that H-1 is the largest,
- 11 most-travelled highway in the State, and at times, the traffic
- 12 noise level from the highway becomes excessively loud in
- 13 neighborhoods along H-1. The legislature finds that it is
- 14 appropriate to determine the feasibility of constructing noise
- 15 barriers along H-1 to reduce the impact of excessive highway
- 16 noise where H-1 runs through or near residential areas.
