A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHYSICAL EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that early instruction in physical education is important to the long-term health of 2 Hawaii's citizenry. Contemporary physical education instruction 3 goes beyond playing games and learning the rules to promoting 5 and furthering the understanding of healthy physical activity habits. 6 7 The purpose of this Act is to promote public school 8 students' long-term physical health. 9 SECTION 2. (a) With regard to public school education, the department of education shall: 10
- 11 (1) Establish programs and activities that promote a

 12 commitment to lifelong physical activity and decreased

 13 sedentary behavior, including the development of

 14 after-school and summer programs, which shall be

 15 taught by licensed physical education teachers

 16 beginning with the 2008-2009 school year;

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1	(2)	Define and implement a developmentally appropriate
2		course of study for physical education instruction in
3		grades kindergarten through six that is taught by at
4		least one licensed physical education teacher per
5		school by school year 2013-2014;

- (3) Implement physical education instruction that is generally in accordance with the standards established by the National Association for Sports and Physical Education as a core requirement for grades seven and eight; and
- (4) Assist and allow high school principals to grant specialized credit for participation in after-school athletic activity and other co-curricular activities by school year 2009-2010; provided that a licensed physical education teacher shall certify that the activity is generally in accordance with the standards established by the department of education for physical education instruction.
- 19 (b) The department of kinesiology and leisure at the
 20 University of Hawaii, the department of education, and the
 21 Hawaii teacher standards board shall work together to establish

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- 1 and implement appropriate policies and programs to actively
- 2 recruit, train, and license physical education teachers.
- 3 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for
- 6 the establishment of after-school and summer programs and
- 7 activities that shall be taught by licensed physical education
- 8 teachers beginning with the 2008-2009 school year.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 10 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$65,000 or so much
- 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the
- 14 establishment and implementation of appropriate policies and
- 15 programs to actively recruit, train, and license physical
- 16 education teachers.
- 17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 18 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 19 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$65,000 or so much
- 21 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the
- 22 University of Hawaii, department of kinesiology and leisure, for



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- one additional faculty teaching position to increase the 1
- University of Hawaii's capacity to recruit and retain licensed 2
- 3 physical education teachers.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- Hawaii for the purposes of this Act. 5
- SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval; 6
- provided that sections 3, 4, and 5 shall take effect on July 1, 7

Description:

Requires the department of education to implement physical education instruction for grades kindergarten through eight; allows credit to be granted for certain athletic and co-curricular activities; provides for the recruitment of licensed physical education teachers; and makes appropriations.
