A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NI'IHAU ISLAND RESERVE COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 2 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 3 as follows: 4 "CHAPTER 5 NI'IHAU ISLAND RESERVE COMMISSION 6 § -1 Administration of chapter. The Ni'ihau island 7 reserve commission and the department of land and natural 8 resources shall administer this chapter. 9 § -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the 10 context otherwise requires: "Commission" means the Ni'ihau island reserve commission. 11 12 "Department" means the department of land and natural 13 resources. 14 "Island reserve" means the area designated as the island of 15 Ni'ihau and the submerged lands and waters extending seaward two 16 miles from its shoreline.

1 "Waters" means the area extending seaward two miles from the shoreline of the island of Ni'ihau. 2 3 -3 Reservation of uses. (a) The island reserve shall 4 be used solely and exclusively for the following purposes: 5 (1) Preservation and practice of all rights customarily and traditionally exercised by native Hawaiians for 6 7 cultural, spiritual, and subsistence purposes; 8 (2) Preservation and protection of its archaeological, 9 historical, and environmental resources; 10 Rehabilitation, revegetation, habitat restoration, and (3) 11 preservation; and 12 (4) Education. (b) The island of Ni'ihau shall be reserved in perpetuity 13 14 for the uses enumerated in subsection (a). Commercial uses 15 shall be strictly prohibited. -4 Powers and duties. The department and other 16 departments and agencies of the State shall be subject to the 17 18 oversight of the commission with regard to the control and 19 management of the island reserve. Subject to section -6, the 20 department shall:

- 1 (2) Enforce this chapter;
- 2 (3) Provide administrative support to the commission; and
- 3 (4) Authorize those of its employees or agents as it deems
- 4 reasonable and necessary to serve and execute warrants
- 5 and arrest offenders or issue citations in all matters
- 6 relating to enforcement of the laws and rules
- 7 applicable to the Ni'ihau island reserve.
- 8 -5 Commission. (a) There is established the Ni'ihau
- 9 island reserve commission to be placed within the department of
- 10 land and natural resources for administrative purposes as
- 11 provided in section 26-35. The commission shall consist of
- 12 seven members who are residents of the island of Ni'ihau to be
- 13 appointed in the manner and to serve for the terms provided in
- 14 section 26-34.
- 15 (b) The governor shall appoint the chairperson from among
- 16 the members of the commission.
- 17 (c) The members of the commission shall serve without pay
- 18 but shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses,
- 19 including travel expenses, incurred in carrying out their
- 20 duties.

1	(d)	Any action taken by the commission shall be approved by
2	a simple	majority of its members. Four members shall constitute
3	a quorum	to do business.
4	(e)	The commission, without regard to the requirements of
5	chapter 7	6, may hire employees necessary to perform its duties.
6	s	-6 Responsibilities and duties of the commission. The
7	general a	dministration of the island reserve shall rest with the
8	commissio	on. In carrying out its duties and responsibilities,
9	the commi	ssion:
10	(1)	Shall establish criteria, policies, and controls for
11		permissible uses within the island reserve;
12	(2)	Shall approve all contracts for services and rules
13		pertaining to the island reserve;
14	(3)	Shall provide advice to the governor, the department,
15		and other departments and agencies on any matter
16		relating to the island reserve;
17	(4)	Shall provide advice to the office of planning and the
18		department of the attorney general on any matter
19		relating to the island of Ni'ihau;
20	(5)	May enter into curator or stewardship agreements with
21		appropriate Hawaiian cultural and spiritual community

organizations for the perpetuation of native Hawaiian

1		cultural, religious, and subsistence customs, beliefs,
2		and practices for the purposes stated in section
3		-3;
4	(6)	Shall carry out those powers and duties otherwise
5		conferred upon the board of land and natural resources
6		and the land use commission with regard to
7		dispositions and approvals pertaining to the island
8		reserve. All powers and duties of the board of land
9		and natural resources and the land use commission
10		concerning dispositions and approvals pertaining to
11		the island reserve are transferred to the commission;
12	(7)	Shall carry out those powers and duties concerning the
13		island reserve otherwise conferred upon the county of
14		Kaua'i by chapter 205A. The powers and duties of the
15		county of Kaua'i and its agencies concerning coastal
16		zone dispositions and approvals pertaining to the
17		island reserve are transferred to the commission;
18	(8)	Shall carry out those powers and duties concerning the
19		island reserve otherwise conferred upon the island
20		burial councils and the department with regard to

proper treatment of burial sites and human skeletal

remains found in the island reserve;

1	(9)	Shall adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 that
2		are necessary for the purposes of this chapter and
3		shall maintain a record of its proceedings and
4		actions:

- 5 (10) May delegate to the executive director or employees of
 6 the commission, by formal commission action, such
 7 power and authority vested in the commission by this
 8 chapter as the commission deems reasonable and proper
 9 for the effective administration of this chapter; and
- 10 (11) May solicit and accept grants, donations, and
 11 contributions for deposit into the Ni'ihau
 12 rehabilitation trust fund to support the purposes of
 13 this chapter.
- 14 § -7 Fishing. Section -3 notwithstanding, the
 15 commission shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to permit
 16 fishing in the waters around Ni'ihau that are consistent with the
 17 purpose of this chapter and that take into consideration the
 18 health and safety of the general public.
- 19 § -8 Penalty. Any person who violates any of the laws
 20 or rules applicable to the island reserve shall be guilty of a
 21 petty misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$1,000 or

- 1 imprisoned not more than thirty days, or both, for each offense.
- 2 Each day of each violation shall be deemed a separate offense.
- 3 § -9 General administrative penalties. (a) Except as
- 4 otherwise provided by law, the commission is authorized to set,
- 5 charge, and collect administrative fines, or bring legal action
- 6 to recover administrative costs of the commission or the
- 7 department, or payment for damages, or for the cost to correct
- 8 damages resulting from a violation of this chapter or any rule
- 9 adopted thereunder. The administrative fines shall be as
- 10 follows:
- 11 (1) For a first violation, by a fine of not more than
- \$10,000;
- 13 (2) For a second violation within five years of a previous
- violation, by a fine of not more than \$15,000; and
- 15 (3) For a third or subsequent violation within five years
- of the last violation, by a fine of not more than
- \$25,000.
- 18 (b) In addition, an administrative fine of up to \$5,000
- 19 may be levied for each specimen of natural resource or any
- 20 historic property taken, killed, injured, broken, or damaged in
- 21 violation of any rule adopted under this chapter.

1 For purposes of this section, "natural resource" 2 includes any archaeological artifacts, minerals, any aquatic 3 life or wildlife or parts thereof, including their eggs, and any land plants or parts thereof, including seeds. Also for 4 purposes of this section, "historic property" means any 5 6 building, structure, object, districts, area, or site, including 7 heiau and underwater site, which is over fifty years old. 8 (d) Any criminal penalty for any violation of this chapter 9 or any rule adopted under this chapter shall not be deemed to 10 preclude the commission from bringing a civil legal action to 11 recover additional administrative fines and costs. Any civil 12 legal action against a person to recover administrative fines 13 and costs for any violation of this chapter or any rule adopted 14 under this chapter shall not be deemed to preclude the State 15 from pursuing any criminal action against that person. 16 In any judicial proceeding to recover an 17 administrative penalty imposed, the commission need only show that notice was given, that a hearing was held or the time 18 19 granted for requesting a hearing has run without such a request,

that an administrative penalty was imposed, and that the

administrative penalty remains unpaid.

9	created i	n the state treasury a trust fund to be designated as
10	the Ni'iha	au rehabilitation trust fund to be administered by the
11	departmen	t with the prior approval of the commission. Subject
12	to this c	hapter:
13	(1)	All moneys received for the rehabilitation and
14		environmental restoration of the island of Ni'ihau,
15		including the island's reefs and fishing areas within
16		three miles of the island, and other purposes
17		consistent with this chapter;
18	(2)	Any moneys appropriated by the legislature to the
19		trust fund;
20	(3)	Any moneys received from grants, donations, or the
21		proceeds from contributions; and

- 1 (4) The interest or return on investments earned from
- moneys in the trust fund
- 3 shall be deposited in the trust fund and shall be used to
- 4 fulfill the purposes of this chapter.
- 5 (b) The commission may use moneys in the trust fund to
- 6 carry out the purposes of this chapter, including hiring
- 7 employees, specialists, and consultants necessary to complete
- 8 projects related to the purposes of this chapter.
- 9 (c) Moneys deposited into or appropriated to the trust
- 10 fund shall remain available until they are obligated or until
- 11 the trust fund is terminated.
- (d) If the trust fund is terminated, all funds shall be
- 13 transferred to the general fund; provided that all unexpended or
- 14 unencumbered balances shall be disbursed in accordance with any
- 15 requirements set by funding sources and for purposes consistent
- 16 with this chapter.
- 17 (e) The commission shall submit an annual report on the
- 18 status of the Ni'ihau rehabilitation trust fund to the
- 19 legislature, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 20 each regular session of the legislature. The annual report
- 21 shall include the total number of and amount of grants,

- 1 donations, and contributions received and balances remaining on
- 2 June 30 of each year.
- 3 § -12 Severability. If any provision of this chapter or
- 4 the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
- 5 invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or
- 6 applications of this chapter that can be given effect without
- 7 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the
- 8 provisions of this chapter are severable."
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
