A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO METAL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 445-231, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 ""Stainless steel beverage container" means an iron-carbon
- 5 alloy product with a minimum of ten per cent chromium content,
- 6 including parts of the product; provided that a stainless steel
- 7 beverage container is not a deposit beverage container, as
- 8 defined under section 342G-101."
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 445-233, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 1. By amending subsection (b) to read:
- "(b) If the scrap presented for purchase is copper or a
- 13 stainless steel beverage container, in whole or in part, the
- 14 seller shall provide a copy of a receipt that describes, with
- 15 particularity:
- 16 (1) The exact item that is being offered for sale;
- 17 (2) Who issued the receipt;



- (3) The date of sale of the item prior to the item's being
 offered to the scrap dealer; and
- 3 (4) The price, if any, of the item when obtained by the seller."
- 5 2. By amending subsections (d), (e), and (f) to read:
- 6 "(d) If the seller does not provide a copy of the receipt
- 7 or the notarized declaration as required by subsections (b) and
- 8 (c), the scrap dealer shall not purchase the copper or stainless
- 9 steel beverage container, in whole or in part, and shall report
- 10 the attempted sale to the police.
- 11 (e) If the scrap dealer purchases any copper or stainless
- 12 steel beverage container, in whole or in part, the scrap dealer
- 13 shall take a photograph or photographs of all of the copper or
- 14 stainless steel beverage containers offered for sale.
- 15 (f) The scrap dealer shall also require the seller to
- 16 verify the seller's identity by presenting a valid photo
- 17 identification card or license issued by a federal or state
- 18 government agency authorized to issue [such] valid
- 19 identification. If the scrap being offered for sale is copper
- 20 or stainless steel beverage container, in whole or in part, the
- 21 scrap dealer shall:
- 22 (1) Take a photograph of the seller; or

- (2) Make a photocopy of the identification card or license
 of the seller."
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 708-835.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 "[{|§708-835.7[}] Theft of copper[+] or stainless steel
- 6 beverage container. (1) A person commits the offense of theft
- 7 of copper if the person commits theft of copper that weighs a
- 8 pound or more, but not including legal tender of the United
- 9 States.
- 10 (2) A person commits the offense of theft of a stainless
- 11 steel beverage container if the person commits theft of a
- 12 stainless steel beverage container that weighs a pound or more.
- 13 (3) Theft of copper or a stainless steel beverage
- 14 container is a class C felony[-]; provided that "stainless steel
- 15 beverage container shall have the same meaning as defined under
- 16 section 445-231."
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 18 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 19 begun, before its effective date.
- 20 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

- 1 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008 and
- 2 shall be repealed on July 1, 2010; provided that section 445-231
- 3 and 445-233, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted in the
- 4 form in which these sections read on the day before the
- 5 effective date of this Act.
