A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LIABILITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 663, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§663- Exception to liability for care rendered by
5	health care provider or health care facility during an
6	emergency. (a) For purposes of this section:
7	"Emergency" means an unexpected occurrence involving
8	injury, the threat of injury, or illness to a person or the
9	public due to:
10	(1) A natural disaster;
11	(2) Bioterrorism;
12	(3) An act of terrorism;
13	(4) A pandemic; or
14	(5) Any other event of similar nature.
15	"Good faith" has the same meaning as provided in section
16	663-1.5
17	"Health care facility" has the same meaning as provided in

18 section 323D-2.

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1	<u>"Hea</u>	alth care provider" has the same meaning as provided in
2	section 3	323D-2.
3	<u>(b)</u>	Care during an emergency includes actual assistance or
4	advice of	fered to avoid, mitigate, or attempt to mitigate the
5	effects o	of the emergency.
6	<u>(c)</u>	Any health care provider or health care facility who
7	in good f	aith assists any governmental agency or political
. 8	subdivisi	on pursuant to subsection (d) shall not be liable for
9	any civil	damages resulting from the provider's or facility's
10	acts or c	missions, unless the provider or facility:
11	(1)	Is grossly negligent;
12	(2)	Caused the emergency; or
13	(3)	Engaged in criminal conduct.
14	<u>(d)</u>	The following activities are exempt from liability:
15	<u>(1)</u>	Implementation of measures to control the causes of
16		epidemic, pandemic, communicable diseases; or other
17		conditions significantly affecting public health as
18		necessary to protect public health pursuant to section
19		321-1;
20	(2)	Investigation, control, and treatment of suspected
21		bioterrorism or disease in response to any public
22		health emergency; or

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1	(3) Response to:
2	(A) A national, state, or county emergency;
3	(B) A public health emergency; or
4	(C) A declaration of the President of the United
5	States or other federal official requesting
6	public health related activities.
7	(e) The immunity in this section is in addition to any
8	immunity protections that may apply in state or federal law."
9	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
10	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
11	begun, before its effective date.
12	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
