### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is no shortage

  of people who want to become teachers in Hawaii's public

  schools. However, under the Hawaii teachers' standards board,

  requirements have been erected that serve as barriers to
- 5 becoming a public school teacher. While the legislature
- 6 supports high standards for teachers, those standards can be met
- 7 through alternative licensing qualifications that are not
- 8 prohibitive to qualified individuals seeking to teach in Hawaii.
- 9 Under the existing standards, people with higher education
- 10 degrees are found to be not qualified to teach in Hawaii public
- 11 schools if they do not hold a degree from a college of
- 12 education. In addition, teachers who taught on the mainland,
- 13 come to Hawaii, and seek to continue teaching receive limited
- 14 credit for their practical prior experience. No credit is given
- 15 for time taught in private schools or at the university level.
- 16 The legislature finds that Hawaii can significantly reduce
- 17 the teacher "shortage" by eliminating the unnecessary barriers

to teaching and putting more of the increased federal moneys 1 2 from the No Child Left Behind Act into supporting teachers and preparing those who enter the field from another profession. 3 The purpose of this Act is to allow the department of education to hire individuals with professional experience and 5 6 university degrees as exceptional teachers and to authorize alternative licensing routes based on performance-based 7 standards commensurate with professional experience in or 8 utilizing the subject area or program to be taught, and giving 9 10 credit toward licensing for prior teaching experience in public schools outside of Hawaii and at accredited private schools, 11 12 colleges, or universities. SECTION 2. Section 302A-501, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 14 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 15 "(b) For the purposes of subpart D: "Board" means the Hawaii teacher standards board. 16 "Emergency hire" or "exceptional hire" means an unlicensed 17 18 employee of the department paid under the salary schedule 19 contained in the unit 5 collective bargaining agreement.

"License" means the document signifying the board's grant

of permission to practice the profession of teaching.

12	without having first paid the fees established by the board in			
13	accordance with chapter 91."

15	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.			
16	SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
