RELATING TO LANGUAGE ACCESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 371-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended as follows:
- 3 1. By adding two new definitions to be appropriately
- 4 inserted and to read:
- 5 ""Purchase-of-service contract" means any and all types of
- 6 formal written agreements, regardless of what the agreements may
- 7 be called, between the State and another legal entity, to
- 8 purchase or otherwise acquire any service for the purpose of
- 9 rendering services to the public.
- 10 "Written language services" means the free provision of
- 11 written information necessary to enable limited English
- 12 proficient persons to access or participate in services,
- 13 programs, or activities of a state agency or covered entity."
- 14 2. By amending the definitions of "access or participate",
- 15 "covered entity", "oral language services", "state" or "state
- 16 agency", and "vital documents" to read:

1 ""Access or participate" means to be informed of, 2 participate in, and benefit from the services, programs, and 3 activities offered by the State and covered entities. 4 "Covered entity" means a person or organization receiving 5 state financial assistance, including grants, purchase-of-6 service contracts, or any other arrangement by which the State provides or otherwise makes available assistance in the form of 7 8 funds to the person or organization for the purpose of rendering 9 services [on behalf of the State.] to the public. It shall not 10 include procurement contracts, state insurance or guaranty 11 contracts, licenses, tax credits, or loan guarantees to private 12 businesses of general concern that do not render services on 13 behalf of the State. "Oral language services" means the free provision of oral 14 15 information necessary to enable limited English proficient persons to access or participate in services, programs, or 16 17 activities[-] of a state agency or covered entity. 18 "State" or "state agency" means any department, office, 19 commission, board, or other agency of the executive, 20 legislative, [and] or judicial [branches of state government, 21 including departments, offices, commissions, boards, or other

Report Title:

Language Access; Definitions; Language Access Advisory Council

Description:

Clarifies the definitions for "access or participate", "covered entity", "oral language services", "state", and "vital documents"; defines "purchase-of-service contract", and "written language services"; requires covered entities to file a language access plan and appoint a language access coordinator; expands the language access advisory council to include one member from each of the counties; makes the executive director of the Hawaii civil rights commission an ex officio member.
