A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Act 260, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, is 1 amended as follows: 2 1. By amending subsection (a) of section 2 to read as 3 4 follows: "(a) There is established the Hawaii anti-trafficking task 5 force. By amending subsections (d) and (e) of section 2 to 9 read as follows: 10 "(d) Not less than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular sessions of 2007 and 2008, the task force shall 11 12 provide to the legislature a report on its activities[-]; 13 provided that not less than twenty days prior to the convening 14 of the regular session of 2010, the task force shall provide the legislature a final report of its activities. 15 16 (e) The task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 17 [2008.] 2010." 18 There is appropriated out of the general 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$10,000 or so much 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for travel

and clerical expenses of the Hawaii anti-trafficking task force.

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- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 2 the attorney general for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008;
- 6 provided that section 1 shall take effect on June 30, 2008.
