RELATING TO INSURANCE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) The insurance commissioner shall prepare a			
2	written r	eport on the adequacy of health plan reimbursements to			
3	physician	s and hospitals in Hawaii. This report shall include,			
4	to the extent practicable:				
5	(1)	A survey of the amount of compensation or salary of			
6		the active, practicing doctors in Hawaii in the			
7		following areas of specialty:			
8		(A) Internal medicine;			
9		(B) Obstetrics and gynecology;			
10		(C) Pediatrics;			
11		(D) Neurology;			
12		(E) Anesthesiology; and			
13		(F) Orthopedics;			
14	(2)	A comparison of Hawaii physician compensation or			
15		salary information to national physician salary			
16		information;			

1	(3)	A su	rvey of the patient co-share payments in Hawaii

3	(4)	A su	rvey of the Hawaii Medical Service Association,

5		with the reimbursements in other states;
6	(6)	A survey of selected providers, including physicians
7		and hospitals, to provide examples of the actual costs
8		of providing health care services in Hawaii;
9	(7)	A survey of students at the John A. Burns School of
10		Medicine to determine whether low reimbursements
11		create a disincentive to practice in Hawaii;
12	. (8)	A survey reflecting the shortfalls in payments by
13		medicare, medicaid, and private insurance to cover
14		costs incurred by hospitals and physicians;
15	(9)	A survey to compare insurance premiums paid by
16		individuals and employers for health plan coverage in
17		Hawaii with insurance premiums paid in other states;
18		and
19	(10)	A survey to compare the average costs of malpractice
20		insurance premiums incurred by physicians and by
21		specialties in Hawaii with other states.

- (b) Each health plan listed in subsection (a) (4) shall 1 2 submit, at the time and in the form prescribed by the insurance 3 commissioner, the information deemed necessary by the insurance commissioner to complete the report required under this section. 4 5 Proprietary or trade secret information submitted in compliance 6 with this section shall remain confidential and protected from discovery, production, and disclosure for as long as the 7 8 insurance commissioner deems necessary. 9 In the final report submitted to the legislature, the 10 insurance commissioner shall report confidential data without 11 disclosing the identity of the source of the data. The insurance commissioner shall report the insurance 12 13 commission's findings and recommendations to the legislature not 14 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular 15 session of 2010. 16 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the compliance
