A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ARCHAEOLOGICAL DATA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
3	read as follows:
4	"§6E- Archaeological data survey; designation. (a)
5	There is established a Hawaii archaeological data survey
6	designated as a program of the State of Hawaii Museum of Natural
7	and Cultural History. The survey shall be an online database
8	accessible to the public. The information within the database
9	may include the collections of the Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum,
10	publicly available materials, and materials from private entities
11	or organizations. The database may include archaeological
12	information including reports, photographs, drawings, maps, and
13	archived documents. The database may also include compilations
14	of collections information from public and private repositories
15	including:

(1) A description of the types and amounts of materials

and associated documentation in each collection;

1	(2)	A listing of the owner or owners of all materials and	
2		associated documentation in each collection;	
3	(3)	A general assessment of the condition of the	
4		components of each collection; and	
5	(4)	Other relevant information pertaining to each	
6		collection.	
7	The data	survey shall be developed and maintained in	
8	consultat	ion with the state historic preservation division and	
9	other appropriate state and federal agencies and private		
10	organizations.		
11	(b)	The archaeological data survey shall not include any	
12	informati	on required to remain confidential under federal,	
13	state, or	municipal laws, rules, or regulations.	
14	<u>(c)</u>	The State of Hawaii Museum of Natural and Cultural	
15	History,	in consultation with the office of Hawaiian affairs and	
16	the state	historic preservation division, may temporarily or	
17	permanently withhold from the database any information due to a		
18	valid thr	eat, or if disclosure may frustrate the legitimate and	
19	necessary	function of protecting a valuable archaeological site	
20	or artifa	ct. The entities shall determine what information	
21	shall be	withheld from the data survey; provided that prior	

- 1 consultation is sought with any affected state or federal
- 2 governmental agencies, or private individuals or organizations."
- 3 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Archaeological Data Survey; Established

Description:

Establishes an archaeological data survey as an online database program under the State of Hawaii Museum of Natural and Cultural History. Authorizes the museum, in consultation with the office of Hawaiian affairs and the state historic preservation division to withhold information from the database if a disclosure may pose a threat to a site or artifact.
