A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATURAL DISASTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. In 2007, the legislature passed H.B. No. 1345,
- 2 enacted as Act 78, to provide \$24,900,000 in emergency funds for
- 3 fiscal year 2006-2007 to cover various operational expenses and
- 4 project costs associated with disaster recovery and mitigation
- 5 efforts in the counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai, and the city
- 6 and county of Honolulu, in the wake of the Kiholo Bay earthquake
- 7 on October 15, 2006.
- 8 The legislature finds that thus far, only approximately
- 9 \$7,500,000 of the total authorized funds has been expended for
- 10 earthquake disaster recovery operations. Continuing adverse
- 11 weather conditions and a lack of qualified contractors have
- 12 delayed projects.
- 13 Typical to most major earthquake disasters, hidden damages
- 14 are not discovered until much later due to the inability to
- 15 immediately access disaster locations and the need to conduct
- 16 detailed engineering evaluations. Most difficult to assess have
- 17 been the damages on the intakes to the Kohala Ditch and Hamakua

- 1 Ditch systems: at this time, the intakes located in the
- 2 Honokane Nui and Waipio valleys are only accessible by
- 3 helicopter or by extremely dangerous damaged foot trails.
- 4 Expert observers have strongly indicated that costs to repair
- 5 the intakes will increase significantly from original estimates.
- 6 Engineering experts also agree that it would be prudent to
- 7 strengthen the intakes rather than simply returning them to pre-
- 8 disaster conditions. This approach would be more cost-effective
- 9 in the long run, ensuring survivability in future disasters and
- 10 reducing frequent maintenance trips into the valleys. The
- 11 legislature believes this approach should apply to all
- 12 structural and nonstructural disaster recovery and mitigation
- 13 projects and a multi-hazard approach as much as is feasible
- 14 should be employed.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for
- 16 structural and nonstructural earthquake recovery and mitigation
- 17 projects, provided that the projects include measures with a
- 18 multi-hazard approach to ensure survivability in future
- 19 disasters.
- 20 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 22 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for



- 1 structural and nonstructural earthquake recovery and mitigation
- 2 projects; provided that the projects include measures with a
- 3 multi-hazard approach to ensure survivability in future
- 4 disasters.
- 5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 6 defense for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.

Description:

Appropriate funds for structural and non-structural earthquake recovery and mitigation projects, provided that the projects include measures to ensure survivability in future disasters with a multi-hazard approach.
