## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL HISTORY BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR SOCIAL SERVICES PROGRAMS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 346-19.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b) The department shall develop procedures for obtaining
4	verifiable information regarding the criminal history and child
5	abuse and neglect registry information of persons who are
6	seeking to become adoptive parents. [These procedures] The
7	department shall [include] obtain criminal history record
8	[checks] information through the Hawaii criminal justice data
9	center in accordance with section 846-2.7[-] and child abuse
10	record information from the department in accordance with
11	departmental procedures."
12	SECTION 2. Section 346-97, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
14	"(b) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
15	91 establishing standards regarding the reputable and

responsible character of service providers who have direct

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1	contact w	ith individuals receiving services under this part,
2	including	:
3	(1)	Licensed adult day care center operators, employees,
4		new employees, subcontracted service providers and
5		their employees, and adult volunteers;
6	(2)	Purchase of service contracted and subcontracted
7		service providers and their employees serving clients
8		of the adult and community care services branch;
9	(3)	Foster grandparent program, retired and senior
10		volunteer program, senior companion program, and
11		respite companion program participants; and
12	(4)	Contracted and subcontracted service providers and
13		their employees and new employees who provide home and
14		community-based services under Section 1915(c) of the
15		Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. §1396n(c))[+] or under
16		any other applicable section or sections of the Social
17		Security Act for the purposes of providing home and
18		community-based services."
19	SECT	ION 3. Section 346-154, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20	amended by	y amending subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows:
21	"(C)	A provider shall:

- (2) Submit to the department a statement signed by any employee hired after the initial licensure or registration that requires the employee to indicate under penalty of law, whether the employee has ever been confirmed to have abused or neglected a child, including threatened harm; and
- (3) Provide consent to the department to conduct a criminal history record check in accordance with section 846-2.7 and a child abuse record check, and to obtain criminal history and child abuse record information for verification.
- 14 The department shall obtain criminal history record (d) information through the Hawaii criminal justice data center in 15 accordance with section 846-2.7, and child abuse record 16 17 information from the department in accordance with departmental 18 procedures on the applicant and any prospective employee of the 19 applicant, including any new employee retained after the 20 applicant is issued a registration or license under this part, which shall include an annual name inquiry into the state 21 22 criminal history record files."

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1	SECTION 4. Section 346-335, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"[4]§346-335[4] Background checks. (a) The department
4	shall develop standards to ensure the reputable and responsible
5	character of operators [and], employees, volunteers, and other
6	adults regularly present, except for adults in care, of the
7	[home and community based case management agencies and operators
8	and other adults, except for adults in care, residing in
9	community care foster family homes as defined in this chapter.]
10	programs identified in section 346-97.
11	(b) An applicant for [a home and community based case
12	management agency license and operators, employees, and new
13	employees of a home and community based case management agency]
14	the programs identified in section 346-97 shall:
15	(1) Be subject to criminal history record checks in
16	accordance with section 846-2.7;
17	(2) Be subject to adult abuse perpetrator checks, if the
18	individual has direct contact with a client. For the
19	purposes of this section, "adult abuse perpetrator
20	check" means a search to determine whether an
21	individual is known to the department as a perpetrator
22	of abuse as defined in section 346-222, by means of a

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1	search of the individual's name and birth date in the
2	department's adult protective service file; and
3	(3) Provide consent to the department to conduct an adult
4	abuse perpetrator check and to obtain other criminal
5	history record information for verification.
6	(c) New employees of the [home and community based case
7	management agency] programs identified in section 346-97 shall
8	be fingerprinted within five working days of employment, for the
9	purpose of complying with the criminal history record check
10	requirement.
11	(d) The department [or its designee] shall obtain criminal
12	history record information through the Hawaii criminal justice
13	data center in accordance with section 846-2.7 on applicants for
14	[home and community based case management agency licenses, and
15	operators, employees, and new employees of home and community
16	based case management agencies.] programs identified in section
17	346-97. The Hawaii criminal justice data center may assess the
18	applicants and operators, employees, and new employees a
19	reasonable fee for each criminal history record check conducted.
20	The information obtained shall be used exclusively for the
21	stated [purposes] purposes for which it was obtained and shall be

- 1 subject to federal laws and regulations as may be now or
- 2 hereafter adopted.
- 3 (e) The department shall make a name inquiry into the
- 4 criminal history records and the adult protective service file
- 5 for the first two years a home and community-based case
- 6 management agency is licensed and annually or biennially
- 7 thereafter depending on the licensure status of the home and
- 8 community-based case management agency.
- 9 (f) An applicant for a certificate of approval as a
- 10 community care foster family home and operators and other adults
- 11 residing in a community care foster family home shall:
- 12 (1) Be subject to criminal history record checks in
- accordance with section 846-2.7;
- 14 (2) Be subject to adult abuse perpetrator checks, if the
- individual has direct contact with a client. For the
- 16 purposes of this section, "adult abuse perpetrator
- 17 check" means a search to determine whether an
- individual is known to the department as a perpetrator
- of abuse as defined in section 346-222, by means of a
- 20 search of the individual's name and birth date in the
- 21 department's adult protective service file; and

1	(3) Provide consent to the department to conduct an adult
2	abuse perpetrator check and to obtain other criminal
3	history record information for verification.
4	(g) The department or its designee shall obtain criminal
5	history record information through the Hawaii criminal justice
6	data center on applicants for certificates of approval as
7	community care foster family homes and operators and other
8	adults residing in community care foster family homes, except
9	for adults receiving care. The Hawaii criminal justice data
10	center may assess the applicants and operators and other adults
11	a reasonable fee for each criminal history record check
12	conducted. The information obtained shall be used exclusively
13	for the stated purpose for which it was obtained and shall be
14	subject to federal laws and regulations as may be now or
15	hereafter adopted.
16	(h) The department or its designee shall make a name
17	inquiry into the criminal history records and the adult
18	protective service file for the first two years a community care

foster family home is certified and annually or biennially

thereafter depending on the certification status of the

community care foster family home."

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1	SECTION 5. Section 352D-4.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
3	"(a) Employees, prospective employees, and volunteers of
4	contracted providers or subcontractors in positions that place
5	them in close proximity to youth when providing services on
6	behalf of the office shall be required to agree to criminal
7	history record checks[-] conducted by the office in accordance
8	with section 846-2.7. The office shall develop procedures for
9	obtaining verifiable information regarding the criminal history
10	records of individuals seeking to serve as employees or
11	volunteers of contracted providers or subcontractors in
12	positions that place them in close proximity to youth when
13	providing services on behalf of the office.
14	(b) Except as otherwise specified, any individual who is
15	employed, seeks employment, or volunteers with a contracted
16	provider or subcontractor in a position that necessitates close
17	proximity to youth when providing services on behalf of the
18	office shall:
19	(1) Submit to the office a sworn statement indicating
20	whether the individual has ever been convicted of an
21	offense for which incarceration is a sentencing
22	option;

1	(2)	Be subject to criminal history record checks through
2		the Hawaii criminal justice data center in accordance
3		with section 846-2.7. An annual name inquiry shall be
4		conducted in the state criminal history record files;
5		and
6	(3)	Provide to the office written consent for the office
7		to obtain criminal history record information for
8		verification.
9	Information	on obtained pursuant to this section shall be used
10	exclusive	ly by the office for purposes of determining whether a
11	person is	suitable for working or volunteering in a position
12	that nece	ssitates close proximity to youth when providing
13	contracted	d services on behalf of the office or in conjunction
14	with serv	ices provided for youth at the Hawaii youth
15	correction	nal facility, while in custody, on furlough or on
16	parole.	All such decisions shall be subject to any applicable
17	federal la	aws and regulations."
18	SECT	ION 6. Section 846-2.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended by	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
20	" (b)	Criminal history record checks may be conducted by:

1	(1)	The department of health on operators of adult foster
2		homes or developmental disabilities domiciliary homes
3		and their employees, as provided by section 333F-22;
4	(2)	The department of health on prospective employees,
5		persons seeking to serve as providers, or
6		subcontractors in positions that place them in direct
7		contact with clients when providing non-witnessed
8		direct mental health services as provided by section
9		321-171.5;
10	(3)	The department of health on all applicants for
11		licensure for, operators for, and prospective
12		employees, and volunteers at one or more of the
13		following: skilled nursing facility, intermediate
14		care facility, adult residential care home, expanded
15		adult residential care homes, assisted living
16		facility, home health agency, hospice, adult day
17		health center, special treatment facility, therapeutic
18		living program, intermediate care facility for the
19		mentally retarded, hospital, rural health center and
20		rehabilitation agency, and, in the case of any of the
21		above-related facilities operating in a private

1		residence, on any adult living in the facility other
2		than the client as provided by section 321-15.2;
3	(4)	The department of education on employees, prospective
4		employees, and teacher trainees in any public school
5		in positions that necessitate close proximity to
6		children as provided by section 302A-601.5;
7	(5)	The counties on employees and prospective employees
8		who may be in positions that place them in close
9		proximity to children in recreation or child care
10		programs and services;
11	(6)	The county liquor commissions on applicants for liquor
12		licenses as provided by section 281-53.5;
13	(7)	The department of human services on operators and
14		employees of child caring institutions, child placing
15		organizations, and foster boarding homes as provided
16		by section 346-17;
17	(8)	The department of human services on prospective
18		adoptive parents as established under section
19		346-19.7;
20	(9)	The department of human services on applicants to
21		operate child care facilities, prospective employees
22		of the applicant, and new employees of the provider

1		after registration or licensure as provided by section
2		346-154;
3	(10)	The department of human services on persons exempt
4		pursuant to section 346-152 to be eligible to provide
5		child care and receive child care subsidies as
6		provided by section 346-152.5;
7	(11)	The department of human services on operators and
8		employees of home and community-based case management
9		agencies and operators and other adults, except for
10		adults in care, residing in foster family homes as
11		provided by section 346-335;
12	(12)	The department of human services on staff members of
13		the Hawaii youth correctional facility as provided by
14		section 352-5.5;
15	(13)	The department of human services on employees,
16		prospective employees, and volunteers of contracted
17		providers and subcontractors in positions that place
18		them in close proximity to youth when providing
19		services on behalf of the office or the Hawaii youth
20		correctional facility as provided in section 352D-4.3;
21	(14)	The judiciary on employees and applicants at detention
22		and shelter facilities as provided by section 571-34;

1	(15)	The department of public safety on employees and
2		prospective employees who are directly involved with
3		the treatment and care of persons committed to a
4		correctional facility or who possess police powers
5		including the power of arrest as provided by section
6		353C-5;
7	(16)	The department of commerce and consumer affairs on
8		applicants for private detective or private guard
9		licensure as provided by section 463-9;
10	(17)	Private schools and designated organizations on
11		employees and prospective employees who may be in
12		positions that necessitate close proximity to
13		children; provided that private schools and designated
14		organizations receive only indications of the states
15		from which the national criminal history record
16		information was provided as provided by section
17		302C-1;
18	(18)	The public library system on employees and prospective
19		employees whose positions place them in close
20		proximity to children as provided by section
21		302A-601.5;

1	(19)	The State or any of its branches, political
2		subdivisions, or agencies on applicants and employees
3		holding a position that has the same type of contact
4		with children, dependent adults, or persons committed
5		to a correctional facility as other public employees
6		who hold positions that are authorized by law to
7		require criminal history record checks as a condition
8		of employment as provided by section 78-2.7;
9	(20)	The department of human services on licensed adult day
10		care center operators, employees, new employees,
11		subcontracted service providers and their employees,
12		and adult volunteers as provided by section 346-97;
13	(21)	The department of human services on purchase of
14		service contracted and subcontracted service providers
15		and their employees serving clients of the adult and
16		community care services branch, as provided by section
17		346-97;
18	(22)	The department of human services on foster grandparent
19		program, retired and senior volunteer program, senior
20		companion program, and respite companion program
21		participants as provided by section 346-97;

1	(23)	The department of human services on contracted and
2		subcontracted service providers and their current and
3		prospective employees that provide home and community
4		based services under section 1915(c) of the Social
5		Security Act (42 U.S.C. §1396n(c)), as provided by
6		section 346-97; and
7	(24)	Any other organization, entity, or the State, its
8		branches, political subdivisions, or agencies as may
9		be authorized by state law."

12	SECT	ION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
