#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE FIRST-TO-WORK PROGRAM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Part XI, chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 1 is amended to read as follows: 2 "[{}]PART XI.[}] [JOB OPPORTUNITIES AND BASIC SKILLS (JOBS) 3 PROGRAM FIRST-TO-WORK PROGRAM 4 [+] §346-261[+] [JOBS] First-To-Work; establishment; 5 There is established a mandatory work program for 6 purpose. certain applicants and recipients of [aid to families with 7 dependent children (AFDC)] temporary assistance for needy 8 families and temporary assistance for other needy families 9 consistent with federal regulations and requirements under [Title 10 IV-F of the Social Security Act, Public Law 100-485] Title IV-A 11 of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. §601 et seg. The purposes 12 of the [job opportunities and basic skills (JOBS)] first-to-work 13 program shall be to encourage, assist, and require [AFDC] 14 temporary assistance for needy families and temporary assistance 15 for other needy families applicants and recipients to fulfill 16 their responsibilities to support their children by preparing 17 for, accepting, and retaining employment. [To assure that needy 18

1	individuals or families are provided the means to avoid long term
2	welfare dependency, JOBS is intended to:
3	(1) Provide individuals with the opportunity to acquire the
4	basic education and skills necessary to qualify for
5	employment;
6	(2) Provide necessary supportive services, including but
7	not limited to transitional child care and medical
8	assistance, so that recipients can participate in the
9	work program and accept employment; and
10	(3) Coordinate job services at all levels of government to
11	facilitate access to a wide range of services and
12	maximize the use of existing resources.]
13	The department shall adopt rules consistent with the requirements
14	of Title IV-A of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. §601 et seq.,
15	and in accordance with chapter 91 for the purposes of this part.

17	-(a) All applicants for and recipients of AFDC shall be
18	required to register and participate in the program; provided
19	that exemptions consistent with federal requirements are applied.
20	(b) The priority target groups under the JOBS program may

2	thirty six of the preceding sixty months;
3	(2) Are applying for AFDC and have received such aid for
4	any thirty six of the sixty months immediately
5	preceding the most recent month for which application

7	(3) Are custodial parents under the age of twenty four
8	<del>years;</del>
9	(4) Are members of a family in which the youngest child is
10	within two years of being ineligible for AFDC because
11	o <del>f age.</del>
12	(c) Exempt applicants for and recipients of AFDC and state-
13	funded public assistance programs may volunteer to participate in
14	the program.
15	(d) The department shall not be required to provide
16	services to all eligible participants, if necessary resources are
17	not available, provided that:
18	(1) Participants not offered specific services due to lack
19	of resources shall be placed on inactive status until
20	these services are available; and

1	(2) Any participant placed on inactive status due to lack
2	of resources shall not incur any negative sanctions as
3	a result of that placement.
4	(e) The department may establish quotas for the target
5	groups under this program to reflect the priorities of this
6	section.
7	[§346-263] Program components. The activities and
8	components of the JOBS program may include, but are not limited
9	to the following:
10	(1) Assessment and identification of barriers to
11	participation;
12	(2) Development of a supportive service plan to remove
13	<del>barriers;</del>
14	(3) Employability planning, including career path
15	<pre>development;</pre>
16	(4) Basic and higher education, including remedial
17	education and English proficiency to help participants
18	<pre>become job ready];</pre>
19	(5) Job skills training;
20	(6) Job readiness and job search;
21	(7) Job placement activities and services;

4	[§346-264] Assessment. An initial assessment of each
5	participant shall determine priority for participation in JOBS.
6	A comprehensive assessment may follow to determine barriers to
7	participation in the program and may include, but is not limited

9	(1) A review of the family circumstances to identify social
10	and health problems and needs; and
11	(2) Identification of child care, transportation, and other
12	supportive services needs.

3	participant, establish and approve a specific employability plan
4	which may include job placement, job training, and education.

6	a participant case management services to support and strengthen
7	the participant's capacity to become self supporting and to
8	facilitate access to resources and opportunities required for
9	self-support. Case management activities may include, but are
10	not limited to:
11	(1) Facilitating activities and services needed by a
12	recipient who is working toward the goal of self-
13	sufficiency;
14	(2) Assisting the individual and the family to obtain
15	services needed to assure effective participation in
16	the program;
17	(3) Facilitating communication between the participant and
18	service providers;
19	(4) Providing initial support, assessment, and referral to
20	appropriate services; and
