A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION BACKGROUND CHECKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 323F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§323F- Criminal history record checks. (a) The Hawaii
5	health systems corporation shall develop procedures for
6	obtaining verifiable information regarding the criminal history
7	of persons who are employed or seeking employment, or are
8	current or prospective contractors, providers or volunteers in
9	any of the corporation's health facilities. The procedures
10	shall include but not be limited to criminal history record
11	checks in accordance with section 846-2.7.
12	The Hawaii criminal justice data center may assess
13	providers and contractors a reasonable fee for criminal history
14	record checks performed. Providers and contractors shall be
15	responsible for payment to the Hawaii criminal justice data
16	center of the fee for the criminal history records checks.

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1	<u>corporati</u>	on, or is a current or prospective contractor,
2	provider,	or volunteer in any of the corporation's health
3	facilitie	s may be required to provide to the corporation:
4	(1)	A sworn statement indicating whether or not the person
5		has ever been convicted of an offense for which
6		incarceration was a sentencing option, and the details
7		thereof;
8	(2)	Written consent for the corporation to obtain criminal
9		history record check information for verification; and
10	(3)	Written consent to be fingerprinted for the purpose of
11		a criminal history record check.
12	Information	on obtained pursuant to subsection (a) and this
13	subsection	n shall be used exclusively by the Hawaii health
14	systems co	orporation for the purposes of determining whether a
15	person is	suitable for working or providing services in any of
16	the corpor	cation's health facilities. All such decisions shall
17	be subject	to federal laws and regulations currently or
18	hereafter	in effect.
19	<u>(c)</u>	Any Hawaii health systems corporation employee,
20	applicant	for employment, or current or prospective contractor,
21	provider,	or volunteer, who has been convicted of a criminal
22	offense fo	or which incarceration is a sentencing option, may be
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- 1 terminated, not hired, released, or not be utilized. This
- 2 action will be based on the corporation's analysis of whether
- 3 the nature and circumstances of the crime may pose a risk to the
- 4 health, safety, or well-being of patients and residents in its
- 5 health facilities.
- **6** (d) For the purposes of this section:
- 7 "Contractor" means any organization or individual that
- 8 enters into a contract or agreement to provide services to the
- 9 patients or residents in any of the Hawaii health systems
- 10 corporation's health facilities.
- "Criminal history record check" means an examination of an
- 12 individual's criminal history records by means including, but
- 13 not limited to, fingerprint analysis and name inquiry into state
- 14 and national criminal history record files.
- "Provider" means any organization or individual that
- 16 currently provides or intends to enter into a contract or
- 17 agreement to provide services to the patients or residents in
- 18 any of the Hawaii health systems corporation's health
- 19 facilities, or is a student in any program at any of Hawaii
- 20 health systems corporation's health facilities.
- 21 (e) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, for
- 22 purposes of this section, the Hawaii health systems corporation



- 1 shall be exempt from section 831-3.1 and need not conduct
- 2 investigations, notifications, or hearing under this section in
- 3 accordance with chapter 91."
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 378-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:

- 7 requirement that inquiry into and consideration of a prospective
- 8 employee's conviction record may take place only after the
- 9 individual has received a conditional job offer, and the
- 10 limitation to the most recent ten-year period, excluding the
- 11 period of incarceration, shall not apply to employers who are
- 12 expressly permitted to inquire into an individual's criminal
- 13 history for employment purposes pursuant to any federal or state
- 14 law other than subsection (a), including:
- 15 (1) The State or any of its branches, political
- subdivisions, or agencies pursuant to section 831-3.1
- 17 and section 78-2.7;
- 18 (2) The department of education pursuant to section
- 19 302A-601.5;

16	history re	ecord improvement revolving fund the sum of \$20,000, or
17	so much th	hereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009,
18	for purpo	ses of this Act. The sum appropriated shall be
19	expended 1	by the department of the attorney general.
