Authorizes the Department of Land and Natural Resources to remove a grounded vessel under its control, by any means necessary, in order to minimize damages to the natural resources and not become a hazard to navigation.

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO GROUNDED

VESSELS.

PURPOSE:

To clarify that, upon assuming control over a grounded vessel, the Department shall remove the vessel by any means necessary in order to minimize damages to the natural resources and not become a hazard to

navigation.

MEANS:

Amend section 200-47.5(b), Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

Presently, when the Department assumes control of a vessel that has been grounded on a coral reef or in imminent danger of breaking up and that cannot be removed immediately by the owner in a manner that is reasonably safe, the statutes require the Department to direct the vessel to a safer location. When encountering situations where the vessel is breaking up or damaged beyond repair and becomes a threat to the natural resource, or a hazard to navigation, total removal of the vessel may not always be practical. As an example, there are vessels aground at the Kure Atoll and off the Honolulu International Airport reef runway that need to be removed in pieces because it has been determined that to remove them whole would cause extensive damage to the natural resources.

This bill would authorize the Department to remove a grounded vessel under its control, by any means necessary, in order to minimize damages to the natural resources and not become a hazard to navigation.

Impact on the public: Would allow the
Department to take action in timely manner



to remove a grounded vessel that has been determined to be a public safety hazard.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Would allow the Department to take immediate action and reduce the cost to remove a grounded vessel that has been determined to be a threat to natural resources or a hazard to navigation.
