A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES FOR AKULE FISH MONITORING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that to understand akule
 fish activity, there is a need to collect and interpret data
 about akule fish movements and habits of migration from Pearl
 harbor to Ka'ena point, Oahu.

5 SECTION 2. The department of land and natural resources, division of aquatic resources, shall increase the number of 6 commercial catch reporting grids from two to three along the 7 8 western coast of Oahu in the sector between Barber's point and 9 Ka'ena point by creating a new catch grid spanning the area 10 between Maile point and Kepuhi point. The new grid shall 11 incorporate sections of the current 402 and 403 catch grids, 12 such that 402 will be reduced to cover only the area from 13 Barber's point to Maile point, and 403 will be reduced to cover 14 only the area from Kepuhi point to Ka'ena point.

15 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the

department of land and natural resources, in conjunction with
 the Hawaii institute of marine biology, to hire a contractor to
 tag and monitor akule fish along the leeward coast of Oahu from
 Pearl harbor to Kaena point, as more fully described in
 section 2.

6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
7 land and natural resources, in conjunction with the Hawaii
8 institute of marine biology, for the purposes of this Act.
9 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
