A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHWAYS.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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2	SECTION 1. The purpose of this part is to:
3	(1) Prohibit the transfer of moneys out of the state
4	highway fund for non-highway purposes; and
5	(2) Require the remittance to the state highway fund of
6	general excise tax revenues from the manufacturing,
7	production, wholesaling, and retailing of liquid fuel
8	for other than airplanes or small boats.
9	The legislature finds that this Act is necessary to ensure
10	that moneys in the state highway fund are expended only for
11	state highway projects as intended. The legislature believes
12	that the highway infrastructure needs a guaranteed source of
13	funding. The legislature further finds that the sources of
14	funding for the state highway fund require enhancements to meet
15	these needs. The legislature also finds that public confidence
16	in government is lessened if moneys intended for highway
17	projects are diverted to other uses.

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         This Act does not affect any provision concerning the
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    authorized revenues of or expenditures from the county highway
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    funds. The legislature intends to honor the principle of home
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    rule in this respect.
         SECTION 2. Section 37-53, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
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         "§37-53 Transfer of special funds. At any time during a
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    fiscal year, notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, any
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    department [may,] with the approval of the governor or the
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    director of finance if so delegated by the governor, may
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    transfer from any special fund relating to such department to
    the general revenues of the State all or any portion of moneys
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    determined to be in excess of fiscal year requirements for such
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    special fund, except for special funds under the control of the
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    department of transportation relating to highways, airports,
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    transportation use, and harbors activities, special funds under
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    the control of the Hawaii health systems corporation or
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    subaccounts under the control of its regional system boards, and
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    special funds of the University of Hawaii. At any time the
    department of transportation, with the approval of the governor
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    or the director of finance if so delegated by the governor, may
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transfer from any special fund, other than the state highway

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- 1 fund, under the control of the department of transportation, or
- 2 from any account within any such special fund, to the general
- 3 revenues of the State or to any other special fund, including
- 4 the state highway fund, under the control of the department of
- 5 transportation all or any portion of moneys determined to be in
- 6 excess of requirements for the ensuing twelve months determined
- 7 as prescribed by rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91; provided
- 8 that no such transfer shall be made [which] that would cause a
- 9 violation of federal law or federal grant agreements."
- 10 SECTION 3. Section 237-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 "§237-31 Remittances. All remittances of taxes imposed by
- 13 this chapter shall be made by money, bank draft, check,
- 14 cashier's check, money order, or certificate of deposit to the
- 15 office of the department of taxation to which the return was
- 16 transmitted. The department shall issue its receipts therefor
- 17 to the taxpayer and shall pay the moneys into the state treasury
- 18 as a state realization, to be kept and accounted for as provided
- 19 by law; provided that:
- 20 (1) The sum from all general excise tax revenues realized
- 21 by the State that represents the difference between
- \$90,000,000 and the proceeds from the sale of any

1		general obligation bonds authorized for that fiscal
2		year for the purposes of the state educational
3		facilities improvement special fund shall be deposited
4		in the state treasury in each fiscal year to the
5		credit of the state educational facilities improvement
6		special fund for public school capital improvement
7		program needs; [and]
8	(2)	A sum, not to exceed \$5,000,000, from all general
9		excise tax revenues realized by the State shall be
10		deposited in the state treasury in each fiscal year to
11		the credit of the compound interest bond reserve
12		fund[-]; and
13	(3)	The sum of all moneys realized from the manufacturing,
14		production, wholesaling, and retailing of liquid fuel
15		sold or intended to be sold to persons for use in
16		motor vehicles or internal combustion engine
17		equipment, but not airplanes or small boats, shall be
18		deposited into the state highway fund created by
19		section 248-8."
20	SECT	ION 4. Section 248-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	amended to	o read as follows:

1	"§24	8-9 State highway fund. [-(a)] Moneys in the state
2	highway f	und may be expended for the following purposes:
3	(1)	To pay the costs of operation, maintenance, and repair
4		of the state highway system, including without
5		limitation, the cost of equipment and general
6		administrative overhead;
7	(2)	To pay the costs of acquisition (including real
8		property and interests therein), planning, designing,
9		construction, and reconstruction of the state highway
10		system and bikeways, including, without limitation,
11		the cost of equipment and general administrative
12		overhead;
13	(3)	To reimburse the general fund for interest on and
14		principal of general obligation bonds issued to
15		finance state highway projects where the bonds are
16		designated to be reimbursable out of the state highway
17		fund; and
18	(4)	To pay the costs of construction, maintenance, and
19		repair of county roads; provided that none of the
20		funds expended on a county road or program shall be
21		federal funds when such expenditure would cause a
22		violation of federal law or a federal grant agreement.

1	[-(b)	— At any time, the director of transportation may			
2	transfer	from the state highway fund all or any portion of			
3	available	moneys determined by the director of transportation to			
4	exceed one hundred thirty-five per cent of the requirements for				
5	the ensuing twelve months for the state highway fund as				
6	permitted by and in accordance with section 37-53. For purposes				
7	of the determination, the director of transportation shall take				
8	into cons	ideration:			
9	(1)	The amount of federal funds and bond funds on deposit			
10		in, and budgeted to be expended from, the state			
11		highway fund during the period;			
12	(2)	Amounts on deposit in the state highway fund that are			
13		encumbered or otherwise obligated;			
14	(3)	Budgeted amounts payable from the state highway fund			
15		during the period;			
16	(4)	Revenues anticipated to be received by and			
17		expenditures to be made from the state highway fund			
18		during the period based on existing agreements and			
19		other information for the ensuing twelve months; and			
20	(5)	Any other factors as the director of transportation			
21		shall deem appropriate.] "			

1	Part II	
2	SECTION 5. The purpose of this part is to generate	
3	additional sources of revenue that may be expended for the	
4	operation, maintenance, and repair of the state highway system.	
5	SECTION 6. Section 251-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
6	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:	
7	"(b) There is levied and shall be assessed and collected	
8	each month a tour vehicle surcharge tax of:	
9	(1) [\$65] \$ for each tour vehicle used or partially	
10	used during the month that falls into the over	
11	twenty-five passenger seat category; and	
12	(2) $[\$15]$ \$ for each tour vehicle used or partially	
13	used during the month that falls into the eight to	
14	twenty-five passenger seat category.	
15	The tour vehicle surcharge tax shall be levied upon the	
16	tour vehicle operator."

18	SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.	
20	SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2040;	
21	provided that the amendments to section 237-31, Hawaii Revised	
22	Statutes, by this Act shall not be repealed when that section is	
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- 1 reenacted on June 30, 2008, pursuant to Act 304, Session Laws of
- **2** Hawaii 2006.

Report Title:

State Highway Fund; Various Amendments; Tour Vehicle Surcharge Tax

Description:

Requires the remittance of general excise tax revenues from liquid fuel sales to the state highway fund. Repeals provisions authorizing transfers of revenues deemed excess out of the state highway fund; replaces the tour vehicle surcharge tax of \$65 for each tour vehicle that falls into the over twenty-five passenger seat category, and \$15 for the eight to twenty-five passenger seat category, with unspecified surcharge amounts. (SD2)
